PARKS & ENGINEERING

ENGINEERING DIVISION

1. **Tourist Attraction Sign Update.** We contacted the State Highway for scheduling, and the Planning phase for Washington County (including Hagerstown) is complete and the Design phase is starting. Design will take 8-12 months. After that it depends on how much funding they receive from the State as to when the sign installation will begin, but even with funding that will take another year after the Design Phase. Now that the Cultural Trail is nearly completed, we are submitting that as another site for this signage program.

2. **2016 Alley Reconstruction Program.** Contractor has started on this project that will include nine alleys. The first two are north of and parallel to West Wilson Boulevard and are expected to be completed by early next week. Demolition has started on Lieba Alley and this long alley will take 3-4 weeks to complete.

3. **South Prospect Street Wall.** Demolition work has started and 50% of the wall was removed.

4. **Cultural Trail.** Rodney presented the project to "American Association of University Women" (AAUW). He has presented the project details to almost 10 service clubs and groups such as this.

5. **Traffic Counts.** We completed speed counts on MD 632 at SHHS for Police Dept and volume counts for the Fall-Fest event at City Park over the weekend. On Saturday there were 2200 vehicles entering City Park compared to a typical day of about 800.


PARKS & RECREATION DIVISION

- **09/15/16:** Officer Culp was flagged down in the area of the University Parking Deck on North Potomac Street for a report of tires being slashed on her vehicle. The victim stated she parked her vehicle on the third level of the parking deck the day before and when she returned to her vehicle that evening she saw her driver's side tires had been slashed. The officer will attempt to locate this incident on a downtown video camera. No further information is available.

No further details are available.
- **09/20/16:** Officer Bauknecht responded to Meritus Medical Center for the report of a possible sexual assault on a minor. The victim's father took his daughter to Meritus for an exam since his daughter told him that a friend of the family touched her in an inappropriate place. The safe nurse at Meritus conducted a Victim Sexual Assault Evidence Collection Kit and the officer placed the evidence kit into HPD's evidence drop box. No further details are available.

Water Production at R. C. Willson

Staff continues to work with Hazen and Sawyer on the Tank Mixing and Traveling Screen Replacement Project. Staff has requested an engineering proposal from Hazen and Sawyer for design and bidding services for the EWIP Grant to replace the low service pumps and motors at R.C. Willson and Pump Station 4.

Operations: Operations were routine this week – staff worked on facility maintenance and routine preventative maintenance.

Maintenance: Staff worked on routine plant maintenance and preventative maintenance on equipment.

Instrumentation

- RC Willson – Repairs to a flow meter on the wash water lagoon have been completed.
- RC Willson – Crews are working on repairs to the filter galley lighting.
- RC Willson – Electrical upgrades continue in the Chlorine room.
- Pump Stations – Preventative maintenance is in progress on the generators.
- Pump Stations – Repairs are in progress on the transducer suction and discharge taps.

Water Production at Breichner/Edgemont Reservoir. The Edgemont Reservoir is being maintained in a dry condition utilizing the 24" sluice gate. The Reservoir floor is fully vegetated to reduce erosion and sediment transport potential. Coordination continues with MDE to ensure compliance with all applicable requirements. The final evaluation for improvements is underway and a report will be submitted to Mayor and Council upon completion. A meeting is scheduled for October 4th with the regulatory agencies having jurisdiction and City staff to discuss permitting, operating limitations, applicable regulatory requirements, etc.

Water Distribution. Distribution crews performed routine customer service work throughout the water service area. Crews also worked on residential meter replacements and routine meter testing. Repairs were made to a water service leak on West Magnolia Avenue, a main break on Iroquois Avenue and a service line on Maugans Avenue. Crews are also installing new services at Freedom Hills. Work still continues on the Frederick Street water main replacement project.


