PARKS & ENGINEERING

PARKS DIVISION

1. **The Fit Room at Fairgrounds Park.** Work continues on our new indoor Fit Room. We installed the door frames and are now installing the ceiling tile and insulation. The electrical contractor continues to install the lights. Installation of an HVAC system is nearly complete.
2. **City Park Lighting.** Staff is preparing for the Hagerstown Heating & Cooling City Park Lighting event! A flyer is attached with all the fun activities planned, including NEW this year - a fire dancer, illuminated ice throne with Frozen Princess Elsa, a heated treat filled hospitality tent, and a new holiday lake light to be unveiled. Please plan to join us on Friday, December 2 from 6-9 p.m.
3. **Golf Course.** Rec Staff are preparing for the 2nd Annual Turkey Cup Tournament **this** Saturday, November 19th, 12 p.m. This two man scramble golf tournament features 18-holes played under a fun and creative setup! The first 9-holes will be a best ball format and the final 9-holes will be a normal two-man scramble. 2. **Alley Reconstruction.** To-date six alleys have been completed and contractor is working on the seventh alley.

 - Safe Routes to School – Haven Road Sidewalk survey has started. We are meeting with State Highway on December 13th to review the funding requirements.
4. **Street Trees.** As soon as the contractor submits the contracts we will issue the Notice to Proceed to replace dead trees in downtown area and plant some new trees for residents.

REPORTS:

11/10/16: Officer Goggin was dispatched to Roberts Oxygen Company on South Potomac Street for a reported malicious destruction of property. The manager advised that he discovered some holes in the windows which appeared to be from a BB gun or pellet gun. The estimated damage to the two windows is approximately \$1,200. There are no known suspects at this time.

11/11/16: Officer Vogel responded to HPD headquarters regarding a stolen bicycle. The victim advised he was at the Salvation Army store on Frederick Street and parked his bike outside the business. After only several minutes he exited the store to find his bicycle gone. He saw two males with his bike and attempted to chase them but lost sight of them. The bike is described a full suspension mountain bike, red, yellow and blue in color. The bike is valued at \$2,750. There are no additional details.

11/12/16: Officer Bricker was dispatched to Washington Street for a report of an armed robbery. The victims stated they were walking to the BB&T Bank to deposit their rent money when two males approached them and demanded their money. One male displayed a knife and the other male displayed a gun. The victims surrendered their money and the suspects fled the area. The Criminal Investigation Division will be following up on this case.

11/13/16: Officer Young was dispatched to Summit Avenue for a report of an overdose. Upon his arrival, Community Rescue Service was already on the scene. The female in the ambulance was identified by her State of Maryland issued ID. Her boyfriend, who was on the scene, advised that he administered Narcan to his girlfriend prior to the arrival of CRS. The female responded to the Narcan and was awake and responsive. She did state to the officer that she injects and snorts heroin on a regular basis. She was transported to Meritus Medical Center for treatment. This case was forwarded to the Narcotics Task Force of Washington County. There are no additional details at this time.

PRESS RELEASES:

On 11/10/16 at 9:38 p.m., Detectives were patrolling and observed two suspicious males. Detectives noticed there were familiar with one of the individuals. When Detectives approached the males, one male took off running. A chase ensued and the male was apprehended. During the course of the apprehension the male was found to be in possession of a handgun. The male was identified as 17 year old Pquyjunte Auni Jacques of Hagerstown. Jacques was transported to Central Booking where he was charged as an adult with the following: Handgun on Person and Possession of Firearm as a Minor. He was released on personal recognizance.

On 11/10/16 at 3:30 a.m. an officer observed a vehicle fail to make a complete stop as it turned onto Park Lane. The officer attempted to get closer to the vehicle and the vehicle began to speed up. As the officers turn onto Forest Drive he witnessed the two occupants of the vehicle bail out. The vehicle continued to move, hitting a bush before coming to a stop in the yard of 829 Forest Drive. A check of the vehicle registration revealed the vehicle had been reported stolen out of Antrim Township in Pennsylvania on 11/07/16. A search of the area where the occupants fled was conducted and officers were able to locate the passenger. Subsequent investigation revealed that the passenger was unaware that the vehicle was stolen. The driver of the vehicle has not been located. The driver is described as a black male, thin build, wearing a dark hoodie with stripes. Water Production at R. C. Willson

Water Distribution staff will begin repairs at the Orchard Hills Tank (piping and valve improvements). The Henson Tank remains off-line for inspection due to corrosion concerns.

Operations:

- Operations were routine this week – staff worked on facility maintenance and routine preventative maintenance.

Maintenance

- Staff worked on routine plant maintenance and preventative maintenance on equipment.
- Staff is still in progress on making repairs to the Sulfuric Acid pump.

Instrumentation

- RC Willson – Repairs have been completed on the third floor lighting.
- RC Willson – Staff are making repairs to the chlorine detector.
- RC Willson – Repairs were made to the potassium feed tank.
- RC Willson – Repairs have been completed on the south stream current monitor.
- RC Willson – Replaced the fluoride machine hopper gasket.

Water Production at Breichner/Edgemont Reservoir

The Reservoir is currently at 0.3 feet (dry level) and the floor is fully vegetated to reduce erosion and sediment transport potential. Staff continues to work with MDE to secure permits for ongoing site evaluation. Triad and Hazen were on-site the week of November 14th to coordinate and complete the subsurface inspection of the ogee and spillway.

Water Distribution

Distribution crews performed routine customer service work throughout the water service area. Crews also worked on residential meter replacements, restores and routine meter testing. Meter tiles and roadway boxes are being adjusted and replaced throughout the system. Repairs were made to the water main on Nottingham Road and Papa Court. Work continues on the Frederick Street water main replacement project.


