ENGINEERING DIVISION

- Sportsplex Feasibility Study.** Held the proposal meeting with potential consultants and issued an addendum. Proposals are due February 8th.
- Prospect Avenue Crosswalk.** Mayor & Council approved contract with Concrete Central for this CDBG-funded project. Contracts have been sent to contractor for execution and we will send letters to adjacent property owners. If weather cooperates, work will begin soon.
- Safe Routes to School.** We attended a "Kick-off" meeting for Safe Routes to School grants. Even though these grants are greatly appreciated, the paperwork and approval process for these Federal grants continues to grow and take three years to complete the project.
- Georeferenced Photo Log.** Jeff Swan has started an ARC/GIS map and database to locate photos on a map by using coordinates collected with cell phones. We encourage other departments to use this map for city-wide photo data-base.

PARKS DIVISION

1. **Bids.** Bids are currently advertised for:
 - City Park Play Equipment
 - City Park Lake Fountain
 - Concession Services
2. **Train.** Two cabooses have been listed for sale. The auctions will end on March 1st.
3. **2018 Hub City 100 Miler.** Registration is officially closed. A total of 1,611 people have registered to challenge themselves to 1 mile a day for 100 days! Here is snapshot of how the program has grown over the years in registration:
 - 2014 – 650 registered
 - 2015 – 775 registered
 - 2016 – 900 registered
 - 2017 – 1,400 registered
 - 2018 – 1600 registered

4. **City Park Maintenance Shop.** A time consuming project, we are installing a new waterline that serves the maintenance shop to replace a failed one.
5. **Tree Maintenance.** Due to the Emerald Ash Borer and age, the tree contractor has been busy in City Park pruning and removing trees.
6. **Building Maintenance.** Required by the State of Maryland effective January 1, 2018, we are installing updated smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors in all facilities where required.
7. **2018 Event Planning.** Staff is coordinating annual dates, times, and activities for 2018. A marketing plan for Spring/Summer events and programs is being completed.

8. **Fit Room.** The February program is attached. New programs include: Unravel & Restore, Fun Fit Fridays (please note, the 2/2 movie night is cancelled due to low enrollment), Healthy Eating Strategies for Busy Families, and PiYo. Two private rentals are confirmed and requests for rentals continue to come in.

- 1200 Pennsylvania Avenue – Milestone Communications – for sign height and sign area variances to construct a freestanding sign which will also serve as a host location to conceal a “stealth” wireless communication facility at Callas Stadium (North Hagerstown High School).

01/25/18: Officer Campbell was dispatched to Antietam Cable on Willow Circle for a report of counterfeit money. An employee stated that a longtime customer had come in to pay on his monthly account and paid with cash. One \$20 bill appeared to be counterfeit and a trip to BB&T Bank confirmed the suspicion. The employee advised the business has never had an issue with this customer. The customer could not remember where he may have acquired this particular bill. The bill was confiscated and deposited in the HPD evidence drop box. The investigation is on-going.

01/26/18: Officer White responded to South Prospect Street for an attempted theft of property. The victim advised the officer that he observed a white male wearing a black parka and a knit hat in his back yard. The male had a shopping cart filled with copper piping. The victim chased the male from his property and saw him run to West Baltimore Street and then turn onto an alley. The officer conducted a search in that area and found the shopping cart but did not locate the male. The contents of the shopping cart was placed into evidence at HPD. The officer is attempting to identify the white male.

01/27/18: Officer T. Helman was dispatched to the Goodwill Athletic Club on North Mulberry Street for a disturbance. Upon arrival the officer approached a dark gray Hyundai and spoke with the driver. Immediately the officer detected the odor of marijuana. At this time a search of the driver and his passenger was conducted and a baggy of a greenish vegetable matter was discovered in the pants pocket of the passenger. The suspected marijuana was confiscated and will be destroyed appropriately. Charges are forthcoming.

The officer did observe the perfectly round dent by the rear driver's side door. The dent is the shape and size of a metal BB pellet. PARKING DECK EQUIPMENT UPDATE

Work to replace the parking equipment began on Wednesday, January 24, 2018. The project began with the installation of the servers (hardware & software) that control and monitor the parking equipment and operations. The gate equipment install began on Monday, January 29, 2018 at the A&E Parking Deck. The installation should be complete in approximately one week. Work will then commence at the UD Parking Deck. Hopefully, both decks will be fully operational by the end of February.

The project started just in time as the existing parking equipment at both decks has completely failed. The gates are up at both decks since the equipment will no longer accept cash or credit cards. Repairs were made to the equipment to keep both decks operational until recently when the supply of parts was no longer available.

Until the new equipment is fully functional, there will be no weekly updates or weekly occupancy charts. The decks are essentially running free until further notice.

City staff and Hazen and Sawyer continue to work with MDE Dam Safety on the final Dam Evaluation Report, Emergency Action Plans, and the design criteria and project schedule. The project continues to be on schedule.

Water Distribution. Distribution crews are working throughout the system performing customer service work and new meter installations as needed. Repairs were made to water main breaks on Twin Springs Drive, East North Avenue, Glendale Drive, Berner Avenue and Rte. 144 between Hump Road and Western Maryland Parkway. A service line leak was also repaired on SOUTH Cannon Avenue. Repairs were made to a hydrant on Leslie Drive.
