## PARKS & ENGINEERING

### ENGINEERING DIVISION

1. **Oak Hill West Neighborhoods 1<sup>st</sup>.** We developed concept plans to reconstruct the island at Burhans Boulevard and Pennsylvania Avenue that will allow the Group to add a neighborhood sign.
2. **Alley Reconstruction Program 2018.** We anticipate bidding this project in about two weeks as we recently added one to the list.
3. **MD Rt 632 (Maryland Avenue extended behind South High).** In response to complaints, the State of Maryland has added crosswalk lights at the intersection of Maryland Avenue at Downsville Road. They have also developed a concept plan to alter the lane use at the rear entrance into South High to eliminate the possibility of southbound cars going around right side of buses.

**REPORTS**

**04/19/18:** While on patrol in the area of Church and Winter Streets, Officer Morris heard gun shots. The officer proceeded to the 600 block of Church Street where he observed three black males running towards his vehicle. Officer Morris recognized two of the males and was able to detain one subject. This detained male gave a description of the shooter and the directions as to where he was running. Officer Morris then transported the detained male to Police Headquarters for questioning. On an adjoining street, other responding officers found a deceased black male with numerous gun shots wounds. After further investigation by members of the Criminal Investigation Division, the remaining two witnesses and the suspect were located, questioned, and charges were filed.

**04/20/18:** Officer Bricker responded to 1020 West Washington Street for an Armed Robbery in progress. The store clerk notified that a black male entered the store, displayed a handgun, demanded money, and then fled the store running towards Gateway Crossing housing. Witnesses gave a suspect description – black male wearing black sweatshirt, mustard colored scarf covering his face, long dread hair. A K9 track was conducted and met with negative results. Surveillance video was reviewed and it was determined that it was the same suspect who had committed an Armed Robbery the previous week at the Salem Avenue 7-Eleven. Both Armed Robbery incidents are being investigated by Detective Brashears.

**04/21/18:** Officer Parks was dispatched to Hagerstown Floors, 1101 Virginia Avenue, for a reported Burglary which occurred overnight. The business owner notified HPD that someone had entered the building through a broken warehouse plexiglass window. Petty cash was stolen from the business office. Surveillance video depicts a white male with facial hair wearing a white hoodie sweatshirt and displaying a distinctive walk. An employee reviewed the surveillance video and recognized the suspect as a former employee. The investigation is continuing.

**04/22/18:** Officer Thompson responded to the 200 block of South Prospect Street for a reported Burglary in Progress. The residence is a foreclosed building owned by the City of Hagerstown. A witness advised that a black male entered a window into the residence. Additional HPD officers responded and while clearing the building, located the suspect male and placed him under arrest.

**04/23/18:** Officers responded to the 300 block of South Mulberry Street for a reported Burglary in Progress. The caller advised the 911 Operator that she was upstairs in the attic and heard a loud bang and glass breaking in the lower part of the house. Officers surrounded the house and found a broken window at the back of the house. A male suspect exited the front of the house. The suspect was interviewed and found to have a cut left hand. Officers found blood evidence inside the residence along with a large amount of firearms wrapped with a large blanket. Dispatch ran the serial numbers of the firearms and one of the items was found to be stolen out of Kansas. The reporting female was also interviewed regarding the firearms and their location. When she went to the attic, the blanket was folded on a chair and the firearms were inside the gun cabinets. The male suspect was charged.

**04/24/18:** Officer Eichelberger was dispatched to the 7-Eleven convenience store located on Salem Avenue for a Robbery in Progress. The store clerks advised that a black male wearing a black mask partially covering his face entered the store and demanded money and cigarettes. One of the clerks gave the suspect the under counter bag, register money, and cigarette packs. The suspect then exited the store and headed towards Salem Avenue. The witnesses described the suspect as 5'11" - 6' in height, light skinned black male, skinny build, wearing a dark plain hoodie and dark jogging pants. They added that the suspect spoke with a heavy accent. The investigation is continuing.

**04/25/18:** Officer White responded to the unit block of West Washington Street for a reported Burglary that occurred overnight. The reporting person notified that copper piping was stolen from inside the building. There is no video surveillance or alarm system. Detective Varner has been assigned to this investigation.

**DLLR REMODEL UPDATE:** Front lobby of the project has been completed and carpet work has begun. Work will continue in the evening and weekends since work cannot be completed during business hours.

**STREET SWEEPING:** One of the two street sweepers has been down for repairs for approximately one month. The engine required to be rebuilt and process has been completed. Two street sweepers should be on the street operating five days per week beginning in May. These street sweepers will be retired once the new sweepers arrive in either late summer or early fall. Sweeping operations is critical to keeping the city clean and to meet the EPA regulations and requirements for storm water management.

**SPECIAL EVENTS:** Staff is gearing up for the event season beginning with Rock the Run 5K Race happening the weekend of April 28<sup>th</sup>. From June through August, there are 16 special events in and around the downtown, starting with Blues Fest on June 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> continuing with Wind Downs, bike races and events on the Square and ending with Augustoberfest the weekend of August 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>.


