DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Main Street: Staff coordinated an informational meeting to the public regarding the upcoming Urban Improvement Project. The meeting was held on Thursday, May 31 in the Council Chambers. Over 20 downtown businesses attended along with representatives from Callas, Morgan Keller, the Maryland Theatre, and Barbara Ingram School for the Arts to learn project schedules and traffic control measures during the project.

PARKS & RECREATION DIVISION

1. **Potterfield Pool.** Opening weekend was a busy one at the pool! 2. **Parks Maintenance and Construction Work.**

Safety	Conditions which are or reasonably present a hazard to occupant or public. <u>Example:</u> No smoke alarms, improper wiring, handrails
Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property <u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration. <u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance. <u>Examples:</u> Uses not permitted in property's zone, construction of new facilities, follow up inspections on open violations.

REPORTS

05/24/18: Officer Reese was dispatched to East Franklin Street in reference to a male sleeping on the steps of City Hall. The male told the officer he just wanted to go home and sleep since he was in pain. The officer asked the male if he needed an ambulance. The male declined the ambulance and the officer arranged to have the male transported home. While waiting for transport the male dozed off numerous times and became extremely disoriented at which time the officer convinced the male that he needed to go to the hospital. The Community Rescue Service arrived and administered Narcan at which point the male became more alert. CRS advised the male was under the influence of an unknown opioid. Agent T. Juarado, of the Narcotics Task Force, responded to the hospital to further investigate the incident. No further details are available.

05/25/18: Officer St. Clair responded to Mealey Parkway in reference to a disturbance. Dispatch advised a group of people were beginning to gather. Upon arrival the officer observed a male who was yelling and pointing to individuals on a porch next door. The officer instructed the male to stop yelling so he could gather information and determine the issue causing the disturbance. The male did not comply and placed his hand on the officer's shoulders. The male was again instructed to stop yelling and calm down since he was causing a public disturbance. The male still did not comply so he was arrested and charged with Assault 2nd Degree, Disorderly Conduct and Fail to Obey.

05/26/18: Officer Brady was dispatched to North Prospect Street for a reported malicious destruction of property. The victim advised that someone had cut the side wall of the passenger side rear tire. The estimated value of the tire is \$150. There is a person of interest. No further details are available.

The League President advised that it appeared that someone had used a crow bar to break into the National Little League storage shed. Damage was done to the door and door frame. 5/27/18: At 12:56 a.m. officers responded to the 200 block of East Franklin Street for a report of a stabbing. Upon arrival officers located an adult male on the sidewalk suffering from multiple stab wounds. The male was transported to Meritus Medical Center where he was later pronounced dead. His identity is not being released at this time.

A K-9 track of the area was conducted but no suspect was located. The incident is still under investigation.

Water Production at R. C. Willson. Operations and maintenance were routine this week at the R.C. Willson Plant and pump stations.

Water Production at Breichner/Edgemont Reservoir. The Edgemont Reservoir pool elevation is currently at 1.0 foot. Site evaluation continues per the contract with Hazen and Triad. City staff and Hazen and Sawyer continue to work with MDE Dam Safety on the final Dam Evaluation Report, Emergency Action Plans, and the design criteria and project schedule. The project continues to be on schedule.

Water Distribution

- Distribution crews are working throughout the system performing customer service work and new meter installations as needed.
- Crews continue to replace residential meters throughout the water service area.
- The large meter testing and hydrant flushing programs are underway.
- Crews responded to a main break on S. Cannon Ave.
- Crews began work on the water main replacement on Hickory School Road.
- A crew is also painting fire hydrants – right now this work is being done within municipal limits.

Laboratory

- Collected composite samples from lagoon discharges.

Explanation:

It is expressed as strokes taken to one decimal place, and is based on yardage and other obstacles to the extent that they affect the scoring ability of a scratch golfer.

A Slope Rating evaluates the relative playing difficulty of a course for players who are not scratch golfers. The lowest Slope Rating is 55 and the highest is 155. A golf course of standard playing difficulty has a Slope Rating of 113.

Course ratings are determined, by permission of the USGA, in accordance with the USGA Course Rating System™ for the purpose of providing a uniform basis of which to issue a Handicap Index. USGA Course Rating, Slope Rating®, and Handicap Index® are marks owned by the USGA and may only be used in connection with the USGA Handicap System™.
