PARKS DIVISION

1. **City Park Fall Fest.** Plans are well underway for the 4th annual City Park Fall Fest to be held rain or shine next Saturday, September 15th from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. In partnership with Porchfest, a shuttle bus will operate between the two festivals. Event highlights include a new craft vendor area at the Hager House, a chainsaw wood carving demonstration, paddle boats and sailboats on City Park Lake, and free tours of all museums in City Park. Free kid activities are also included!

1. **Potterfield Pool.**

- Potterfield Pool is officially closed for the season.
- Staff received many thank you notes from kids who attended Washington County Day Camps. Two of the thank you notes we received are attached.
- The Annual Pooch Plunge, coordinated by the Humane Society, was held September 5, 2018. There was a total of 122 dogs and 260 people in attendance.

3. **Hager House.** Staff is doing a thorough cleaning of the Hager House this Sunday in preparation of City Park Fall Fest on September 15th. During Fall Fest, the Hager House will be open to the public for free tours. Staff is working on a new exhibit in the Museum for Fall Fest which details the Washington County Historical Society's journey to renovate and restore the founder of Hagerstown's 1739 limestone home. The Museum will feature historic photographs of the process, some never seen before by the public!

REPORTS

08/31/18: Officer Thompson was dispatched to the Locust Street Market on South Potomac Street for a report of a theft. The victim stated that one of his soda machines had been broken into. His surveillance video showed two black juveniles repeatedly kicking the soda machine until it opened. The juveniles left but returned with a trash can and filled it up with sodas to take. It was estimated that the juveniles took approximately \$65 worth of sodas. Both juveniles were identified by the police. Charges will be forthcoming.

09/01/18: Sgt. Bobetich assisted a female that came to the Hagerstown Police Department reporting a theft. She stated she currently resides in a homeless camp located on West Antietam Street and someone had stolen money from her wallet. She advised she had two \$20 bills when she last checked her wallet. The other residents of the camp were out for the day. The officer checked to see if any City surveillance cameras captured that area. There is no suspect at this time.

09/02/18: Officer Keefer responded to Stadium Tavern on South Cannon Avenue for a robbery in progress. An employee stated that someone tapped him on the shoulder and said, "Come with me." When the employee turned around he saw an unknown male pointing a black handgun at him. The employee yelled "gun" and ran from the kitchen to the bar area. This action startled the suspect and he fled the business running down the path between Municipal Stadium and the drainage canal. The Washington County Sheriff's Office assisted with a canine tack down the drainage canal. The suspect is described as 5 feet 9 inches tall, approximately 200 pounds, wearing a dark button up style long sleeve shirt, black hat, blue surgical mask, wearing blue surgical gloves, blue jeans and carried a light colored bag. The Deputy discovered a blue surgical mask and two blue surgical gloves during the track down the canal. There is a person of interest. No further details are available.

09/03/18: Officer Biden was dispatched to Hayes Avenue for a reported assault. The victim had visible trauma to his face from the assault. The victim explained that he was accused of stealing cigarettes from one of his neighbors. A friend of the neighbor came looking for the victim and the assault took place. An ambulance arrived and treated the victim but he refused to go to the hospital. The victim advised he did not wish to file charges on the neighbor or his neighbor's friend. No further information.

09/04/18: Officer Keefer arrived at AC&T, 1701 Dual Highway, for a reported theft. An employee advised that a white male entered the store asking for two cartons of cigarettes. The male grabbed the cartons and ran out while the cashier attempted to ring up the transaction. The male made no attempt to pay and fled the store and left in a green Toyota Echo with a Delaware registration plate. This same vehicle was seen at the 7-11 convenience store on Dual Highway. An officer in the area responded and observed the green Toyota with Delaware tags unoccupied but with the engine was running. The driver exited the store and was approached by the officer. The male driver admitted to the theft and was placed under arrest and placed into the police cruiser. The suspect's Toyota was towed from the parking lot of 7-11. No further details are available.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

Traffic Control
