Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens

REPORTS

11/29/18: Officer T. Helman responded to the Family Dollar Store on Dual Highway for a reported counterfeit \$20 bill. The officer made contact with the manager and she stated a regular male customer gave a \$20 bill to pay for his purchases. The manager advised the customer that his bill was counterfeit. He stated he received the bill as change from a restaurant at the corner of North Potomac Street and East Franklin Street. The bill was placed into HPD property for safe keeping. There are no further details regarding this incident.

11/30/18: Officer Parks was dispatched to Elizabeth Street for a report of a theft that occurred approximately two weeks ago. The reporting party advised he was missing his grandfather's Optima muzzle loading rifle from his residence. When the grandson could not locate the rifle he assumed his grandfather had moved the rifle or had taken the rifle to his residence. When the grandson asked his grandfather about the rifle he became concerned since his grandfather stated he did not move the rifle. The grandson remembered that he permitted a friend to spend the night at his residence about two weeks ago. The grandson, his grandfather, and the visiting guest are the only persons that knew about the location of the rifle. The officer will be checking to see if the rifle has been pawned. This case is pending further investigation.

12/01/18: Officer Moczydlowsky responded to Frederick Street for a reported disturbance in progress. Upon arrival, an adult white male walked out of the residence and directly towards the officers who had responded. Because of the male's aggressive behavior, officers attempted to handcuff the male for the safety of those present. The male resisted arrest, but after a brief struggle he was handcuffed and placed in the police cruiser. Officers then began to interview witnesses to determine what caused the incident. The male's wife stated that her husband had been drinking and began to yell and argue with her. Her husband became so aggressive towards her she called her sister for help. The wife left her residence to stay at her sister's home. The officers determined that the male had not assaulted anyone and would not be arrested but that he needed to go inside for the night and sleep. A neighbor said he would see that the male got inside and remained there. However, the male once again became aggressive and pulled away from the officer and kicked the side of the police cruiser. The male was then placed under arrest and charged with Disorderly Conduct and Resisting Arrest.

12/02/18: Officer Wolfe was dispatched to South Mulberry Street for a report of malicious destruction of property. The victim stated that someone had spray painted the side of her car and damaged the driver's side mirror. She believed that her ex-boyfriend may be responsible for the damage stating he had caused damage before. The officer will attempt to locate surveillance cameras in the area that may have captured the incident. The damage to repair the vehicle is approximately \$1,800. The investigation is on-going.

12/03/18: Officer M. Anderson observed a white Hyundai with Maryland registration travel eastbound on West Church Street. As the vehicle approached the intersection of West Church and Avon Road, the driver in the Hyundai ran the stop sign. The officer activated his overhead lights and siren and pulled over the Hyundai. As soon as the Hyundai stopped, the driver attempted to get out of his vehicle but the officer ordered him to remain inside the vehicle. The officer conducted the standard check on the driver and discovered the driver had two active warrants from Washington County, a fugitive warrant out of

Pennsylvania, and he was driving on a suspended driver's license. An inventory search of the vehicle was conducted prior to towing the vehicle. The officer located a BB gun under the driver's seat and a glass pipe commonly used to ingest marijuana. The individual was placed under arrest for the warrants and charged with Transporting a Weapon, Possession Drug Paraphernalia and numerous Traffic Violations.

OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION

Happy Retirement to Lt. Carvel Wright. Lt. Wright was honored with a retirement luncheon at Police Headquarters on November 16, 2018. Lt. Wright's wife and his father were able to attend the event. Lt. Wright has been employed by the City of Hagerstown for 35 years. He was hired on January 10, 1983 and has worked his way through the ranks. He was promoted to Lieutenant on August 6, 2001. He was then assigned as one of the Commanders to the Patrol Division. Later in his career, he became the Lieutenant in charge of Internal Affairs. He also served as Administrator for the Body Worn Camera Program, Delta Plus System, and the Firearms Return/Disposal Program. Lt. Wright was diligent in his assignments and gave much attention to detail. We wish him well with his future endeavors.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
