	<u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants.
	<u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration.
	<u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance.

REPORTS

12/06/18: Officer White responded to The Terrace for a report of a burglary. The victim stated that someone had stolen a Sony camera and lens from the residence. The camera is valued at approximately \$579 and the lens is valued at approximately \$339. Apparently the back door was not secured and the suspect entered through that door. There are no suspects at this time and no further information is available.

12/07/18: Officer Decker responded to Aldi's on Dual Highway for a reported threat. The manger stated that a disgruntled employee made threats to "shoot up" the store. The store manager was concerned for the safety of the other employees and wanted to take precautions with additional security. Due to the history of the employee, Aldi was taking the threats seriously. The Hagerstown Police Department stated they would make additional checks on the store. The employee was apprehended and arrested. No further details are available.

12/08/18: The Washington County Emergency Communication Center received multiple 911 calls in the area of Wesel Boulevard and South Burhans Boulevard. The 911 caller was verbally abusive and uncooperative with the 911 call-taker. The caller stated that she lives in a homeless camp and someone is preventing her from taking her medications. The officer responded to the area of the camp but could not locate the caller. The officer used the intercom of the cruiser to ask the caller come from the woods to receive help. The officer then cleared the call. However, the caller called 911 again and stated she was not leaving the woods because she was drinking. Officers searched the woods, in the dark for about two hours and were finally able to locate the caller. She stated she took her medication and no longer needs assistance. The officers questioned her as to why she did not call 911 and cancel the search for her. She gave no answer. She is being charged with Misuse and Abuse of 911 Emergency Services.

12/09/18: Officer Vogel was dispatched to Liberty Gas Station located on West Washington Street for a report of a robbery. The victim stated he was assaulted and robbed by three individuals near Madison Avenue. The victim stated a friend asked to borrow some money and they were to meet on Madison Avenue. The victim arrived and exited the vehicle when he saw his friend. The victim stated that two unknown black males appeared and began assaulting him with a brick. One of the males raised his shirt and displayed a handgun. The group went through his pockets and took his cash and his medication. The victim stated there was a female in the group as well. The female was described as a white female, short in height with long black hair and freckles. The group fled the scene in a black Jeep Cherokee with Maryland tags. No further details are available at this time.

12/10/18: Officers Todaro and Keefer responded to Elizabeth Street to assist EMS with an unresponsive male. Child Protective Services received a tip on possible child neglect at this residence. The person left in charge of watching the three children in the home had fallen asleep and the children were unattended. It was discovered that the person left in charge of the children was a juvenile himself. The mother returned home and Social Services had requested a meeting to set up a safety plan for the children. No further details are available.
