Safety	Conditions which are or reasonably present a hazard to occupant or public. <u>Example:</u> No smoke alarms, improper wiring, handrails
Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property <u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration. <u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance. <u>Examples:</u> Uses not permitted in property's zone, construction of new facilities, follow up inspections on open violations.

REPORTS

12/12/18: Officers responded to South Cannon Avenue for a report of a disturbance involving a weapon (a brick). When officers arrived on scene, the suspect had already left the area. The caller stated that the suspect fled the scene when he advised the suspect that he had pepper spray and would use it on him. With a description of the suspect given, the officers observed the individual walking towards Public Square. Officer Dean advised the suspect to place his hands behind his back however the suspect refused. At that point, the suspect began to yell and shout obscenities. The officers advised the suspect that he needed to calm down and stop yelling. The suspect continued and was therefore placed under arrest and transported to Central Booking. The suspect told officers that he was going to put the brick through the car window because he was mad at the owner of the vehicle. The suspect was charged with Disorderly Conduct and Disturbing the Public Peace.

12/14/18: Officer Todaro was dispatched to South Locust Street for a reported suspicious person taking packages from porches. The caller gave a description of the suspect and he was later seen walking through the Central Parking Lot. The officer approached him and he had a package in his hands. At first, the suspect stated that he found the package in an alley with no name on the box. He later admitted he took two packages and ripped off the name on the box. The suspect took the officer to the other package he had stored at another location. The labels were located as well. The packages were recovered and transported to the owners. The suspect was transported to Central Booking and charged with Theft Less \$100 and Theft \$100 to Under \$1,500.

12/15/18: Officer C. Kelley was on patrol in an unmarked police car in the area of Eastern Boulevard. The officer observed a white Hummer bearing Maryland registration swaying smoothly from left to right. He then saw the Hummer make a right turn from a middle lane. The officer continued to monitor the vehicle as it turned onto Jefferson Boulevard and then on to Atlantic Drive. The officer activated his emergency lights and conducted a traffic stop. The officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the driver's breath. The driver stated that he had two beers at the Starlight in Funkstown. The officer conducted the Standardized Field Sobriety Test. The driver did not want to continue the tests and told the officer to just arrest him. He was transported to Central Booking and charged with Making an Improper Turn, Failure to Drive on Right of Center, Driving Under Influence of Alcohol and Driving While Impaired by Alcohol.

12/17/18: Officer Eichelberger was dispatched to South Prospect Street for a Malicious Destruction of Property report. The victim stated that her vehicle had been keyed sometime on 12/17/18 between 12-4 p.m. The officer inspected the victim's Honda Civic and saw that it had been keyed on the driver side back quarter panel. The victim stated she believes this incident may have involved her neighbor. The officer will continue the investigation with this person of interest. No further details are available at this time.

12/18/18: Officer Bartles responded to East Oak Ridge Avenue for a report of a stolen U-Haul vehicle from Roy's Quality Care. The manager advised the stolen U-Haul vehicle is described as a 17 foot, 2010 Ford Econoline E450. The vehicle is valued at \$30,000 if purchased new. The person who rented the vehicle did not return it on the required date of November 29, 2018. The manager had made numerous calls to the renter, however the call goes directly to voice mail. This vehicle had not been returned to any U-Haul agency in the USA. The officer entered this vehicle into the National Crime Information Center as stolen. No further details are available.

Parking Occupancy: Per the Holiday Free Parking program, the gates at both decks are raised Friday afternoon through Monday morning every weekend through the New Year. This action is creating issues with providing accurate occupancy numbers. The occupancy charts will resume after the first of the year when the gates are placed back into normal operations.

Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

Four electric vehicle charging stations have been placed into operation as of Tuesday December 11, 2018. This work was previously approved by the Mayor and Council granting the Electric Vehicle Institute, LLC (EVI) permission to install the units. The cost to the City was zero dollars. The charging stations can be found in the Elizabeth Hager Center parking lot at 14 North Potomac Street.



For now, the electric to charge a vehicle is free to the user. The Parking System will pay for the electric. It does cost to park at this location. The fee is \$1 per hour which is twice the rate in the remainder of the parking lot. The parking meter heads have also been painted green to indicate a different meter rate at this location (handicap meters are blue, 30-minute meters are red).

AFTER HOUR CALL BACKS

- 12/15/18 @ 10:45 a.m.: Emergency Services alerted Public Works of the Columbia Gas trench washing out at Antietam Street and Burhans Boulevard causing hazardous road conditions. Staff contacted the supervisor for the gas company. A crew was dispatched to the scene to remedy the issue.
- 12/16/18 @ 5:30 p.m.: Antietam Street and Burhans Boulevard intersection once again washed out creating hazardous conditions for drivers. Staff spent over one hour getting Columbia Gas to respond. The gas company responded later that evening to make repairs. Permanent repairs were scheduled for Monday the 17th.

SPECIAL EVENTS

- Donut Drop on Monday, December 31st. Staff will set the city stage, provide traffic control, supply numerous trash receptacles and post streets for "No Parking." Public Works will also clean up area when employees return to work on Wednesday January 2nd.

STREET WORK

- Several collapsed drains are being rebuilt in alley 2-41 which runs parallel to Madison Avenue to the west. The brick walls have fallen apart due to age and street vibrations.
- Street sweeping continues on a daily basis. The new street sweepers are working very well. No sweeping will occur during the Christmas Holiday of December 24th and 25th.
- Private property abatements continue to trickle into our office for completion. The work is mostly trash and debris removal.
