DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Community Partners Workshop: Mayor Bruchey and DCED staff coordinated a workshop on Wednesday morning for community partners who have customers/clients with employment needs. Information was shared about Proctor & Gamble’s hiring process and employment opportunities. Approximately 15 partners attended. Youth Advisory Council: Staff coordinated a meeting on Thursday at the Burobox to continue discussions on the formation of the Hagerstown Youth Advisory Council. Approximately 15 community leaders attended.

Main Street: Main Street Leadership Group and Main Street Business Relations work group met for their monthly meetings this week.

Ribbon Cutting: Unlocking Resilience (Owner: Jennifer Canby, MSW, LCSW-C) and Keep Exploring Yourself (Owner: Danielle Hudak, MSW, LCSW-C) are sharing a Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting! The Open House will be held on Wednesday, February 13th from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. with the Ribbon Cutting at 12 p.m. with Councilwoman Emily Keller presiding. Unlocking Resilience and Keep Exploring Yourself are individual therapy practices that provide trauma services to children, youth, adults, families, professionals, and community systems. They also both utilize *Helpers Armor*, a seven-week program that assists therapists, social workers, teachers, nurses, police officers, case workers, etc. in combating compassion fatigue, burn out, and/or secondary traumatic stress, with the goal of contributing to the well-being of Washington County.

House Fire - Fairview Road: A house fire at 1100 Fairview Road displaced a family on Saturday, February 2, 2019. There was heavy fire and smoke showing from second floor windows when firefighters arrived at 8:42 a.m. The fire, which was discovered by a resident of the home, was mostly contained to one room. The fire was suppressed quickly however the residents are not able to return to the home due to smoke damage throughout the house. Luckily the home was equipped with working smoke alarms which alerted the resident who was in the home.

ENGINEERING DIVISION

1. **Urban Improvement Project.** Met with business owners and addressed several issues. We are working with the Maryland Theatre and BISFA regarding the permanent parking on Potomac Street when construction is complete.
2. **Imagine Hagerstown.** Worked with DCED staff to determine entertainment venue sites and determined electrical needs and improvements.

3. **Forest Conservation Bill.** The State has introduced a law to revise how Forest Conservation moneys can be collected from developers and whether we will be allowed to spend the money in Hagerstown, and establishes more steps we would have to deal with. We reviewed this and sent comments to Steve Bockmiller to forward to MML.

REPORTS

02/01/19: Officer Decker was dispatched to Cannon Avenue for a reported disturbance. The victim stated that she and her child's father got into a verbal argument. The father began throwing contents from the trash can all over the kitchen floor. He also took the victim's truck key. The officer asked the male to return the truck key and leave the residence. The male continued to try to control the situation. Again, the officer warned the male to give the key back and leave the residence or be arrested. The male refused to cooperate, which resulted in the male being arrested and charged with Trespass Private Property and Fail to Obey Lawful Order. The truck key was found in his pants pocket. No further details are available.

02/02/19: Officer McKinley was conducting stationary marked traffic enforcement on West Franklin Street. While doing so, he observed a black Lexus traveling west with an inoperable driver's side headlight. The driver did not immediately pull over and traveled approximately 250 feet before pulling to the shoulder. The officer asked the driver's for his license and registration. Dispatch ran a check on the driver and found that his license had been suspended. About that time the officer observed the passenger throw a white colored object out the passenger side window. The officer called for a K-9 assist. Upon arrival, K9 Officer Bartles located two baggies of a white substance not far from the vehicle. K9 Officer Kelley conducted a search of the vehicle, and during the search a calf sock was discovered that contained a fully loaded handgun. Dispatch advised the handgun was listed as stolen from Florida. In addition to this handgun, officers found a large sum of money on both the driver and passenger. Both suspects were transported to Central Booking and charged with various drug and handgun violations. The driver was also given several traffic citations. It should be noted both males were in violation of their probation.

02/03/19: Officer M. Anderson responded to Mulberry Street for a report of a theft of a vehicle registration plate. The victim advised that he noticed his Maryland plate missing around 8:30 a.m. The area was checked, however the plate was not found. No further details are available.

02/03/19: Officer Fuqua was dispatched to Washington Avenue for a found child. The caller stated he heard crying coming from outside and when he went to look he saw a young toddler (approximately three years old) in the street. The child was in his sleeping attire and had no socks or shoes on. The caller took the child in his residence to keep warm until the police arrived. Officer Thompson, who was familiar with a residence on Winter Street that frequently had children unsupervised, arrived on the scene to assist. Officers made contact with the father who was found sleeping in his residence. The father stated his son must have unlocked the door and wandered out to the street. This case was referred to the Child Protective Services.

02/04/19: Officer Todaro responded to East Antietam Street for a reported robbery. The victim stated he was smoking a cigarette in the picnic area to the rear of Soul Haven. The victim had his book bag next to him leaning up against a picnic table. A male approached him and asked for a cigarette. Then without any warning, the suspect grabbed the book bag and fled the area. The book bag contained medications, a wallet, US currency, bank cards, an ID card and a cell phone. The bag and contents are valued over \$500. The suspect was described as a mixed-race male, approximately 6' tall, who was wearing a red Jeff Gordon hat. There were two witnesses to this incident. No additional information is currently available.

Happy Retirement to Jeffrey Kercheval

On Friday, February 1, 2019, fellow employees recognized and honored Jeff Kercheval at his retirement gathering. Jeff graduated from South Hagerstown High School and then attended The George Washington University, Washington DC, where he earned his Masters of Forensic Science. He began his career with the Hagerstown Police Department in October of 1986 and has given 33 years of diligent service.

Jeff served as the Supervisory Forensic Chemist of the Western Maryland Regional Crime Laboratory (WCRCL) that is located at HPD Headquarters. Jeff was instrumental in his duties which also included assisting with cases for the Washington County Sheriff's Office, The Narcotics Task Force, The Hancock Police Department, The Boonsboro Police Department and The Smithsburg Police Department. Some of his responsibilities included processing latent prints, testing firearms, drug analyses, examining crime scenes, just to name a few.

We appreciate Jeff's dedication and hard work over the last 33 years as he was truly instrumental in providing valuable information to assist in solving police cases. Though we know Jeff will be enjoying retirement, HPD is pleased to add that Jeff has offered to help in the lab as needed. We wish him well and congratulate him on a well-deserved retirement!

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

After Hour Call Backs. There were no call backs for issues after hours for this week.

Snow Operations. Two storms hit the City this week. The first storm was on Tuesday, January 29, 2019, and the other on Friday, February 1, 2019. Both storms were relatively minor. Two inches of snow fell on the first storm and approximately four inches on the Friday storm. Unusually warm temperatures starting on February 2nd dissipated the snow pretty quickly. Additional road salt was ordered to restock the supply and will be delivered by February 8th.

Student Parking. Staff began accepting applications for the new student parking as of Friday, February 1, 2019. The number of student parking permits per week is being recorded in **Chart No. 1 (above) – General Parking System Data** at the beginning of this report. There are currently six student permits.

Roslyn Window Project Update. A total of 64 new windows have been installed in the Roslyn Building. A final walkthrough is scheduled for Thursday, February 7th to review any outstanding issues. This was the final major project for this building before the sale of the property in March.

Deck for Hana Thai Dining. The deck replacement project is almost complete. The handrail should be completed by Friday, February 8th. Final inspections should occur shortly thereafter. The deck is for the staff of the restaurant only and gives them direct access to their kitchen. The restaurant staff has been very patient through this process.
