PARKS & ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

ENGINEERING DIVISION

1. **Marsh Run Concrete Wall Repairs.** Construction began June 27th. We delivered letters to the nearby businesses and released a Traffic Advisory to advise that the westbound lane of Memorial Boulevard will be closed in the daytime and that access to gas pumps will be limited for four to five weeks.

2. **Carr Street and First Street Sidewalk Improvements.** A pre-construction meeting was held. A Notice to Proceed was issued for Monday July 1st. The contractor will complete Carr Street first and then move to First Street. We delivered letters to the residents on Carr Street and will be issuing a Traffic Advisory as well.

3. **Pavement markings.** Midlantic, Inc. started applying thermoplastic stopbars, crosswalks and arrows on June 21st. Approximately 30 intersections have been completed. There are approximately 45 intersections remaining. Staff has provided a map and list of faded long lines to be "re-painted" with waterborne traffic paint. We expect that work to take place in the coming weeks. Work on the overlay streets and bike lanes will take place later this Summer.
4. **Parking Lot Landscaping.** We advertised a RFP for Landscaping at Rochester Lot and Church Street parking lots.
5. **Safe Routes to School Grant.** Staff reviewed the latest project with the consultant to add radar speed boards to Maryland Avenue and Summit Avenue and flashing beacon RRFB on Northern Avenue at Short Street crosswalk.

REPORTS

06/20/19: Officer Young responded to the Maryland Theatre on South Potomac Street for a burglary. An employee from Ellsworth Electric advised the officer that when he arrived on the job site he discovered the electrical storage room had been broken into. The employee stated that the company moved their materials to the storage room due to a burglary the previous weekend. The suspect entered the storage room by kicking out a section of drywall in an adjacent room. Total damages and stolen materials from Ellsworth Electric are valued at \$3,300. Borlie Mechanical also stored their materials in the same storage room. They are reporting stolen items valued at \$330. Detective Varner is the investigator on the case and there are two persons of interest at this time.

06/21/19: Sergeant Plummer was contacted at HPD by a victim reporting her 2018 Honda Ruckus moped to be stolen. She gave permission to her boyfriend to use the moped. Her boyfriend in turn allowed another friend to borrow the moped for a brief period of time. However, that friend did not return the moped. The victim tried to reach the friend but was not successful. The victim contacted a family member of the friend and she stated she would help retrieve the moped for a fee. At this point the victim decided to ask for help from the police. The moped was entered into NCIC as stolen. Pictures of the moped were sent out to the officers at HPD and the Washington County Sheriff's Office. No further details are available.

06/23/19: Officer Miscannon responded to Summit Avenue for a report of an assault. The victim stated that he got into an argument with his child's mother. Another family member got involved in the argument and tried to stab the victim with a small knife. The female family member scratched the victim with the knife and her nails. The officer did observe scratches on the victim's left wrist. The officer advised the victim that since he knows the suspect, he could file his own charges at the District Court Commissioners Office. No further details are available.

06/24/19: Officer Vogel was dispatched to Oak Hill Avenue for a report of theft from a motor vehicle. The victim advised that sometime overnight an unknown individual stole the wheel and tire off his vehicle. The victim's vehicle is described as a 2014 Nissan Altima bearing Maryland tags. When the victim went to his vehicle in the morning, the jack was still under the vehicle and the lug nuts were on the ground next to the vehicle. The tire and wheel are valued at \$500. There are no suspects at this time.

06/25/19: Officer Bartles responded to West Washington Street for a report of a male lying on the sidewalk with his feet in the street. The male appeared to be asleep or perhaps under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. The officer attempted to speak with the male but he did not respond. The officer then began to nudge the male but received no response. The officer administered two sternum rubs and the male began to mumble. At that point Officer Bartles assisted the male in sitting up. The male was identified and the officer contacted Dispatch to see if the male had any outstanding warrants. While the officer was in contact with Dispatch, the male decided to urinate in public; exposing himself to oncoming traffic. The male was taken into custody and charged with Indecent Exposure and Urinating in Public.

06/26/19: Officer Wolfe was dispatched to 38 South Potomac Street for a report of a burglary. The construction site manager advised that he had received an alarm the previous night, however the manager spoke to the employee on scene who stated that he did not believe anything had been taken. When the manager arrived, he discovered that two rolls of copper wire had been moved and placed near a window. That particular window led to the construction area of the building. The construction site manager stated that he knew the wire was not left at the window the day before and he felt that someone may have entered the building through the construction area in an attempt to steal the rolls of copper wire. It was then discovered that the fence on the East side of the construction area had been pushed open. An unlocked window to the building was also discovered. Thankfully the construction site manager said nothing seemed to be missing and he was thankful the suspects were not successful in taking the rolls of copper wire. There are no further details.

PRESS RELEASES

On 06/24/19 at 11:26 a.m. officers responded to the 200 block of Suter Avenue for a report of a shooting. Upon arrival, officers located evidence that an assault of some type had occurred. Around the same time, the officers were advised that a male had arrived at Meritus Medical Center with a gunshot wound. The male was identified as 27 year old William Allan Scales of Hagerstown. Through investigation it was revealed that an altercation took place in the 200 block of Suter Avenue between Scales and 36 year old Donteau Lewis Jennings of Hagerstown. During the altercation, both Scales and Jennings brandished weapons and fired at each other. After the altercation both males ran from the scene. On 06/24/19 at 4:05 p.m., detectives located Jennings in the first block of East Avenue in Hagerstown. He was taken into custody without incident and was transported to The Washington County Detention Center. He is charged with Attempted 2nd Degree Murder, 1st and 2nd Degree Assault, Reckless Endangerment, Handgun on Person and numerous other Handgun Violations. He is currently being held without bond. William Allan Scales remains in critical but stable condition at Meritus Medical Center and charges are pending.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
