REPORTS

11/28/19: Officer K. Hill responded to Snyder's Service Center on Virginia Avenue for a report of a theft from a motor vehicle. The caller advised he is an employee of the Service Center and that when he arrived he found all four tires missing from a 2006 black Chevrolet Monte Carlo which was at the Service Center for repairs. The employee has been unable to reach the owner by phone but did leave a voicemail message. The stolen tires are valued at approximately \$400 (\$100 per tire). There are no suspects at this time.

11/30/19: Officers Romero and St. Clair were dispatched to St. Clair Street at approximately 1 a.m. in reference to a group of juveniles starting a fire in the grass. When the officers arrived on scene, the juveniles began to scatter. One juvenile ran in one direction and five other juveniles ran in another direction. The officers followed the five juveniles and were able to catch up with them. The juveniles did admit they started the fire. The ages of the juveniles varied in ages from age 12 to 14. The juveniles stated they were at a birthday party and decided to sneak out, however that information proved to be false. The parents of the juveniles were contacted. Some parents responded to the scene and their child was released to their custody. Other parents requested a police transport for their child. The sixth juvenile was also located. All six juveniles were charged with Curfew Violations. The Fire Chief requested a copy of the police report for his investigation.

12/01/19: Officer Repp and Officer K. Hill responded to Avalon Avenue for a report of vandalism to a vehicle. The victim stated that her red Ford Focus had four slashed tires. The victim did give a name of an individual that could possibly be a person of interest. There were no witnesses. The estimated value for replacement of the damaged tires is \$600.

12/02/19: Officer St. Clair observed a red and white off-road dirt bike on South Prospect Street make a U-turn causing the officer to slam on his brakes. The officer activated his emergency lights to conduct a traffic stop when the dirt bike left the street and traveled on the sidewalk. It should be noted the driver of the dirt bike was wearing a ski mask. The officer lost track of the dirt bike and deactivated his emergency lights. The officer continued on his patrol beat when he saw that same dirt bike parked at a convenience store. The officer pulled up next to the dirt bike as the driver attempted to leave. The officer ordered the driver to stop. The officer was close enough to grab the arm of the driver which caused the driver of the dirt bike to lose control of the bike and fall to the ground. The driver resisted arrest and was uncooperative with the officer. The officer discovered the driver of the dirt bike had his license revoked in Maryland and the dirt bike was not registered. The driver was charged with resisting arrest.

12/03/19: Officer Mazloun responded to Sheetz located on East Washington Street for a reported trespasser. Upon the officer's arrival, the suspect attempted to leave the parking lot. The officer was able to confront the individual about the No Trespass letter on file for him. The suspect stated he had forgotten about the letter that was issued to him. The officer issued a Criminal Citation to the suspect for trespassing private property and ordered the suspect to leave the Sheetz property. The suspect complied.

OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION

Congratulations to Officer Curtis Kelley. Officer Curtis Kelley has been selected as Officer of the Month for October 2019. Officer Kelley has been employed by the City of Hagerstown for 12 years and is currently assigned to the Patrol Division as a K-9 handler.

In October 2019, Officer Kelley and other HPD officers responded to a report of a suicidal male who had poured a flammable liquid on himself and was threatening to set himself on fire. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with the male. The male's clothing appeared to be soaked with an unknown liquid and the male was holding a lit candle. While officers attempted to talk to the male, he began pouring an unknown liquid on himself. The male then attempted to light himself on fire with the candle. Officer Kelley sprang into action and sprayed the male with a fire extinguisher, preventing him from successfully lighting himself on fire. While the male was distracted and stunned from the fire extinguisher dust cloud, officers moved in and safely took him into custody before he was able to harm himself or anyone else on scene.

Based on his quick actions and ingenuity, Officer Curtis Kelley has been selected as the Hagerstown Police Department Officer of the Month for October 2019. The Hagerstown Police Department is proud to have dedicated officers such as Officer Curtis Kelley as one of its own and congratulates him for a job well done.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY


