PARKS DIVISION

1. **City Park Train Hub.** Staff is meeting with The Roundhouse Museum to plan the 2020 Railroad Heritage Days event. Staff will also be taking 15 tubs of model train accessories and scenery as a donation to the Roundhouse Museum for their indoor model train exhibits (approved by M&C).

4. **City Park Mansion House.** Repairing leaky waterline and other minor plumbing issues; also replaced interior leaking sewer line.

REPORTS

01/23/20: Officer L. Dean responded to the area of Berner Avenue and West Washington Street for a reported shots fired call. The caller stated that he heard approximately eight shots. Officer Dean located a 2007 Infinity that had several bullet holes in it and nine shell casings near the vehicle. The shell casings were collected, photographed, sealed and placed into HPD evidence. A lab request was submitted for the shell casings. No additional information is available at this time.

01/25/20: Officer Kimmel was dispatched to East Franklin Street for a disturbance. Dispatch advised that two males were beating on another male. The officer located a Hispanic male covered in blood. It was apparent that the male was intoxicated and sustained swelling to his right eye and a small laceration on the left side of his head. Emergency Medical Service arrived and transported the male to Meritus Medical Center for treatment. Due to the language barrier of the assaulted male, the hospital contacted a hospital translator to gather information regarding the incident. The officer was then able to gather names and locations to help with the investigation. No further details are available at this time.

01/26/20: Officer Huff responded to Bob Evans Restaurant located on Railway Lane in reference to a theft from a motor vehicle. The victims stated that they entered the restaurant to have lunch and when they returned to their vehicle they noticed a door was left ajar. They discovered that a brown purse, containing credit cards and other important items, had been taken from the vehicle. It has been estimated that the items stolen were valued at approximately \$500. The officer advised the victims to contact their financial institutions and cancel the cards. The officer checked surveillance cameras in the area but was unsuccessful in viewing the incident. No further details are available.

01/27/20: Officer Repp was dispatched to Mitchell Avenue for a stolen vehicle report. The lessee of the stolen vehicle stated he loaned this vehicle to a female friend and now the vehicle is being reported stolen. The female friend stated that she went into her mom's residence and apparently left the keys in the vehicle. The car is a rental with New York tags. Later that day Dispatch advised the Ford Fiesta was found abandoned in a field in the area of Jefferson Street. The lessee of the vehicle stated that items were missing from the vehicle and valued at approximately \$350. The vehicle was never entered into NCIC as stolen due to it being promptly recovered.

PRESS RELEASES

01/25/20: At 8:34 p.m. officers responded to the 100 block of Randolph Avenue for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival officers observed a male displaying a handgun inside a residence. When officers gave commands for the male to drop the weapon, the male fled on foot. Officers located the male, 22 year old Terrence Levi Eckard of Hagerstown, to the rear of the 100 block of North Potomac Street. Eckard was placed under arrest and found to be in possession of a handgun. There were no injuries. Eckard was transported to The Washington County Detention Center where he remains held. He is charged with Handgun on Person, Loaded Handgun on Person, Illegal Possession of Ammo and Knowingly Alter Firearm ID Number.

01/29/20: HPD Detectives have arrested 17 year old Christopher Love Jr. of Hagerstown, in the connection with the shooting that occurred in the 500 block of George Street. During the incident, one subject was shot and three unoccupied vehicles were struck and damaged by gunfire. Love was transported to The Washington County Detention Center where he is being held without bond. Christopher Love Jr. is charged with the following: Attempted 2nd Degree Murder, 1st and 2nd Degree Assault, Malicious Destruction of Property, Reckless Endangerment, Handgun on Person, Possession of a Firearm by a Minor, Illegal Possession of Ammunition, Regulated Firearm-Illegal Possession and Firearm Use in Felony Violent Crime.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOUR CALL BACKS

- Tuesday, January 21, 2020 @ 5 p.m.: A bill got jammed in the Pay On Foot (POF) machine located at the A&E Parking Deck. Staff was called in to clear the jam and place the unit back in operation.
- Saturday, January 25, 2020 @ 8:30 a.m.: The POF machine at the A&E Parking Deck jammed again late Friday night. Staff was called in early Saturday morning to clear the mangled bill and place the machine back in operation.

SEASONAL STAFFING. The City is already advertising for seasonal staffing to assist with laborer work like mowing and trash collection. These employees would not begin until late March or early April. Some applications have already been received. The seasonal work force is generally employed for up to 7 months of the year while others may only work for the summer. They are a real help in maintaining the City's public right of ways with mowing, trash collection, painting and other general duties.

WARM WEATHER WORK. The unusually warm Winter is allowing staff to work on some concrete projects. For example, a storm drain lid was broken at Locust Point that needed repaired. Upon inspection, it was decided to replace the entire inlet. Concrete work will continue as long as the weather holds out.
