Business Development Update:

Main Street Open House: Staff coordinated a 2020 Main Street Open House on Wednesday at the Burobox. Approximately 30 attended the event which was held to engage the community and talk about what Main Street is, what it stands for, and what it can do for the downtown Hagerstown businesses and community. Main Street has received 14 volunteer applications following Wednesday's event!

1. **Solid Waste Collection History.** As requested by Waste Management, below is a chart that shows the recent history of tonnages collected by year. The highlighted values are the peak amounts. Not recycling glass dropped the tonnage by around 700 tons which added \$28,000 in landfill disposal costs from 2017 to 2019.

REPORTS

01/30/20: Officer K. Hill responded to a barber shop on West Franklin Street for the report of a robbery. When the officer arrived the victim was in handcuffs. The victim stated that two unknown males walked into his shop and ordered him to place his hands in the air. He then was handcuffed while the other suspect placed a gun to the head of the patron in the shop. The suspects took the victim's cell phone, car keys, jewelry and \$300 in US currency. The two suspects fled the area. The victim's car was not stolen and was not tampered with in any manner. The suspects were located on a City surveillance camera. The investigation is on-going.

02/01/20: Officer Daveler was dispatched to East Washington Street for a report of a disturbance. The caller stated that his ex-girlfriend had just been released from being incarcerated and she wanted to stay at his apartment. When the caller refused to allow her to reside there a verbal argument occurred which lead to an assault on the caller. She began to disturb the residents in that apartment complex. She was instructed by the officer to calm down and leave the area. She did not comply and was subsequently arrested and charged with Assault 2nd Degree, Disturbing the Peace, Disorderly Conduct and Fail to Obey Lawful Order.

02/02/20: Officers from the Hagerstown Police Department responded to Garlinger Avenue in reference to a disturbance that involved a male with a knife. Officer Huff and Officer St Clair approached the back yard of the residence in question and located the male. Officer Huff gave verbal commands to the male to keep his hands up. Officer St Clair then began to pat the male for a possible weapon. The officer located a pocket knife with a three inch blade in the suspect's front pocket. The victim stated that she was on the front porch with a friend when the suspect jumped a fence and approached her with a knife. The victim's friend tried to intervene on the victim's behalf and this allowed the victim to break free from the suspect and run inside the residence. The suspect was apprehended and charged with Assault 1st Degree, Assault 2nd Degree-2 counts and Reckless Endangerment.

02/03/20: Sergeant Hay was dispatched to City Park in regards to an off duty officer observing a male with a gun in his waistband. The male was located in the Park and Sergeant Hay began to pat the suspect down in search of a weapon. A black BB gun, handgun style, was located in the suspect's front pants pocket. The suspect was transported to Central Booking and charged with one count of Hagerstown City Code 173-11, possession of a BB gun in the City limits.

02/24/20: Officer Batistig was requested by Fire Marshal Crist to meet him at his office located at 25 Church Street. Crist stated that a white male walked into his office to report that he was assaulted by his girlfriend and she stole his vehicle. The male advised Officer Batistig that his live-in girlfriend assaulted him and then took his car keys and left the apartment. He further stated that the girlfriend is not listed as a co-owner of the vehicle and was not given permission to use the vehicle. The vehicle, a 2017 Chevrolet Impala, with Iowa tags was entered into NCIC as stolen. Sometime later, the owner contacted the officer and notified him that the vehicle was returned and in good working condition. The officer advised the owner that he could seek District Court assistance if he would like to file charges against the girlfriend. The vehicle was removed from NCIC.

PRESS RELEASES

On 02/04/20 at 4:30 p.m. officers from the Hagerstown Police Department Violent Crimes Unit along with The Maryland State Police Gang Unit conducted a traffic stop in the area of the 800 block of West Franklin Street. Upon stopping the vehicle, the driver's side passenger, 18 year old Javontae Rasheed Hart of Hagerstown, fled on foot. After a brief foot chase Hart was taken into custody. Officers searched the area where Hart had fled and located a small waist pack containing a loaded handgun. Hart was transported to The Washington County Detention Center and charged with the following: Handgun on Person, Loaded Handgun on Person, Possession of Firearm by Minor, Firearms Possession with Felony Conviction, Regulated Firearm-Illegal Possession and Illegal Possession of Ammunition. Javontae Hart remains detained without bond.

This investigation was a coordinated effort between the Hagerstown Police Department and the Maryland State Police under the Maryland Criminal Intelligence Network (MCIN). The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention (GOCCP) provides grant funding and strategic support to MCIN member sites to identify, disrupt, and dismantle criminal organizations through inter-agency collaboration and data sharing to make Maryland safer. The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention funded this project under sub-award number, MCIN-2020-0015. OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION

Jeffrey Morgan, Coordinator of Recruitment at HPD, scheduled an entry level testing for the position of police officers on Saturday, February 1, 2020. The testing was slated to begin at 10 a.m. and the second test was set for 2 p.m. There were 34 individuals that attended the testing on Saturday. Mr. Morgan was encouraged with the number of individuals that were interested in being employed as a police officer with the Hagerstown Police Department.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

BRIDGE TO CHANGE UPDATE. The REACH shelter is doing a great job with hiring the homeless and using their skill to keep the City clean. Dana Jenkins, Executive Director of REACH, has provided the following update: *Also, some sunshine: I just ran January data and the crew has picked up ~37,000 gallons of trash. There have been 23 participants (5 only started in January), 7 permanently housed, 12 employed or in a job services program and 22 in Case Management services (many have started behavioral and mental health services). We are moving them towards independence!! Thank you for all of your support.*
