Safety	Conditions which are or reasonably present a hazard to occupant or public. <u>Example:</u> No smoke alarms, improper wiring, handrails
Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property <u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration. <u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance. <u>Examples:</u> Uses not permitted in property's zone, construction of new facilities, follow up inspections on open violations.

REPORTS

04/01/21: Officer Perez Velez and Officer Filges were patrolling on East Franklin Street when they observed a black Honda Accord traveling without tail lights being illuminated. The officers activated the emergency lights and pulled the vehicle over to make a traffic stop. Officer Filges made contact with the driver and a juvenile passenger. There was a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The officer requested the driver and passenger exit the vehicle. When asked if a weapon was in the vehicle, the

passenger immediately fled the scene. He was later apprehended by Sergeant Plummer. A handgun was located under the seat of the juvenile passenger. The Maryland Gun Center was contacted and they advised that the juvenile passenger was prohibited to possess a handgun for numerous reasons. The driver of the vehicle was given a written citation for driving without tail lights. The passenger was arrested and charged with several weapon violations.

04/02/21: Sergeant Cox was contacted by the City Parks Department in reference to an abandoned vehicle. The vehicle had been parked in the basketball court parking lot for over three days and had not moved. The vehicle was described as an older Chevrolet sedan with a West Virginia registration. The vehicle was locked and the vehicle contained what appeared to be two bags of clothing in the back seat. Sergeant Cox made an attempt to contact the owner but was unsuccessful. Sergeant Cox left a parking violation warning on the windshield that stated the vehicle would be towed in 24 hours if not moved. The vehicle was not moved after 24 hours and was subsequently towed by Freestate Towing.

04/03/21: Officer Daveler was in a marked cruiser actively patrolling when she observed a female attempting to separate two fighting males. The incident was on West Franklin Street in front of the County Commuter Bus Stop. Both males were engaging in a heated argument. As the officer approached the males, the one male began to leave the scene, but then returned. Both males were advised to stop yelling and leave the area. One male complied but the other male did not. The uncompliant male was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct and Disturbing the Peace.

04/04/21: Officer Fuqua and Sergeant Batistig were dispatched to Domino's Pizza on North Prospect Street for a physical disturbance. There was a female causing a disturbance over a pick-up order, however the female left the scene before the officers arrived. The store manager stated that the female came into the store to pick up her order and she was highly intoxicated. After receiving her order, she became irate with the employees and then punched the plexiglass at the counter and caused it to break. Employees made an attempt to remove the female from the store, however she assaulted an employee in the process. The cost to replace the plexiglass was estimated at \$200. The female was taken into custody on Jonathan Street and was transported to Central Booking and charged with Assault 2nd Degree and Malicious Destruction of Property.

04/07/21: Officer Zupan responded to Hagerstown Spring Works on East Baltimore for the report of a theft from a motor vehicle. The owner of the business stated he believed this theft may have been by three males who had previous stolen from his property. The victim advised the officer that the suspects took three car batteries from his truck. He estimated the value for each battery would be \$150. The victim told the officer he would be installing additional cameras and a spotlight on his property. He also requested that HPD conduct special checks to his property whenever possible.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
