PARKS DIVISION

REPORTS

04/15/21: Officer C. Kelley responded to Nottingham Road in reference to a trespassing complaint. While en route, Dispatch advised there was a male laying on the ground and he had been struck with a baseball bat. The injured male stated he had been struck with the bat by his father. The father was on scene and further stated he did not want his son on his property due to his unlawful behavior. The father further stated his son came at him with a board and he was just trying to defend himself. Community Rescue Services arrived and treated the injured male and transported him to Meritus Medical Center for further treatment. The officer advised he would not be charging either party and they could file their own charges against each other at District Court if they wished.

04/16/21: Officer Daveler was dispatched to Meritus Medical Center for a report of an attempted suicide. A resident of Julia Manor Nursing Home was transported to Meritus Medical Center. It was originally unknown if the overdose was intentional, however it was confirmed by EMS that it was an attempted suicide. The resident convinced his wife to bring all of his medicine from home to him at Julia Manor. It should be noted his wife did not know of his intent nor did the nursing home staff. The resident stated he wanted to die and this was his plan. Due to all of his suicidal statements, the appropriate emergency petition paperwork was completed and disseminated appropriately. No further details are available.

04/18/21: Officer Zupan responded to Salem Avenue for the report of a theft. The victim stated the previous night her boyfriend allowed a mutual friend to stay at her residence. The next morning the friend was gone and so was her daughter's bright pink Hoverboard. The hoverboard was valued at \$125.00. The friend is described as a black male, approximately 6 ft. tall with a short beard and weighing approximately 200 pounds. The victim was unsure where the friend may be found. The officer checked local pawn shops and discovered the Hoverboard had indeed been pawned. The employee of the pawn shop gave the officer the name and a copy of the suspect's driver's license. The officer applied for theft charges against the suspect. No further details are available.

04/18/21: Officer Williamson was dispatched to South Potomac Street for an assault report. Upon arrival two females identified themselves and stated they had been robbed at gunpoint on East Lee Street. The two females stated they were from Virginia but had come to Hagerstown to hang out for the weekend. The two females were in Sheetz and the one female needed to use the ATM machine. While at the machine she was approached by a black male who identified himself only by his street name. The male wanted to know if she wanted to hang out with him and they exchanged phone numbers. The two females met the male at the designated place. Upon arrival, the male pulled a gun on the female who withdrew money from the ATM and demanded all her belongings. Another black male appeared and assisted with the robbery. They took her cash, phone and her car keys and fled the area. The officer was able to locate a City camera that captured the two suspects get into a silver in color Hyundai SUV. The investigation is continuing.

04/20/21: Officer McNew responded to East Lee Street in reference to a vehicle parked in a "No Parking Zone" for Craig Paving. The signs were clearly posted and verified for no parking on the 100 block of East Lee Street between the dates of 4/20/21-4/23/2021. The officer attempted to locate the owner but was unsuccessful. The 2013 Ford Fusion was towed by Wrenches and Wreckers with no hold.

04/21/21: Officer Bartles was dispatched to North Locust Street for the report of a burglary. The victim stated that her child's father lived at this address but he passed away several months ago and she has been living elsewhere. She stated she came over to the residence to clean and vacuum and heard noises from the second floor. She became fearful and left the residence. She returned later and was unable to enter the residence and it appeared the lock had been changed. She began to kick in the door and heard individuals running out the front door. She searched the residence and found nothing missing but did find CDS paraphernalia on the second floor. She then contacted the police. The investigation is on-going.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
