ENGINEERING DIVISION

1. **Wesel Boulevard.** Our contractor, C. William Hetzer, has broken the remaining roadway work into three phases in order to minimize the impact on and access to the retail and commercial users to the west. The below is an estimated timeline:

- April 27 – May 21: Complete phase (roadway reconstruction and base paving) between Building 1's western entrance and Sister City Drive (front of Lowe's retail).
- May 24 - July 2: Complete phase (roadway reconstruction and base paving) between Sister City Drive and Heister Street (at Chick-Fil-A)
- July 5 – July 30: Complete phase (roadway reconstruction and base paving) between Heister Street and project limits to the west.

- Staff is blacktop patching holes as well as patching several areas around the concession stand and park benches.
- The entire infield of the softball area is being enlarged requiring us to strip sod and replace with ball diamond sand.
- We are determining pedestal locations so we can begin trenching for the final part of the up-lighting project.

3. **Fairgrounds Park.** In preparation for a replacement roof over the Parks & Recreation office, staff is removing concrete block walls, two metal stairways, drilling six new drain holes and removing eight small parapet walls.

- Election of Officers. The commission unanimously voted to retain the current leadership (Douglas Wright, Jr., as chair; James Stone as vice chair).

REPORTS

04/22/21: Officer K. Hill made contact with a resident of Forest Drive who wanted to report a theft from her vehicle. The victim was advised that her vehicle's car door was open. She stated her Tesla has an alert system on it but apparently the locking system did not work properly and the vehicle was left unsecured for the night. The vehicle was not damaged but her bank card was stolen. The card had already been used twice at Byers Stop N Go. She contacted her bank but was too late to stop the transactions. The officer will see if any neighborhood camera captured the incident. No further details are available.

04/23/21: Officers were dispatched to Lidl Grocery Store on the Dual Highway for the report of a theft. The store manager stated the business was missing a bank deposit from March 27, 2021. The deposit was placed in the store safe on March 26, 2021, and was marked for deposit on March 27, 2021, however that deposit was not made according to their bank. There is a person of interest. Sergeant Cox was assigned to further investigate this case.

04/24/21: Officer Nichols responded to Meritus Medical Center in reference to an assault that occurred on Jonathan Street the evening prior. The victim advised he was walking from his residence on John Street to the Boost Mobile located on Franklin Street. He was confronted by three individuals in the area of Jonathan Place Apartments. There were two black males and one white female in the group. The one male called out to him and the group then approached him and began to punch him. The group managed to take his cash and then fled the area. Officer Nichols will be reviewing City camera footage to see if the incident was captured on film.

04/25/21: Officer Romero was flagged down on West Franklin Street for the report of a broken store front window. The officer believed someone vandalized it by throwing a hard object through the glass. Glass was seen on the inside of the restaurant. The doors had been locked and it did not appear anyone was inside. The Fire Department arrived to assist securing the property. Office Romero took photos and then reviewed the City cameras in an attempt to identify the suspect. No additional information is available at this time.

04/26/21: Officer Wertz was dispatched to the CVS on North Cannon Avenue for the report of a black female entering the store with her breasts exposed. Dispatched advised the female in question had just left the store and was traveling in the direction of McDonald's. Officer Wertz observed the female at the drive-thru of McDonald's. The female had positioned herself between two vehicles in the drive-thru line. It should be noted the female was not wearing a shirt or a bra. The officer was familiar with the female from prior calls and escorted her to his cruiser. A by-stander offered his shirt to cover the female. The officer searched the female and found capsules with a white residue in her pants pocket. The female did state to the officer she used heroin earlier in the day and she was now having chest pains. The female was transported to Meritus Medical Center. The officer will be filing charges on the female for indecent exposure and possession of drug paraphernalia.

04/27/21: Officer Routhier responded to Prohibition Hub on South Potomac Street for a disturbance. There was a female beating on the window in an effort to get the manager to permit her to enter. The female stated to the officer she wanted to talk to her child's father who was in the business but the manager would not permit her to enter. Officer Routhier spoke with the manager and she stated the female was not permitted in the business due to her ongoing issues there. The officer explained to the manager that he could serve a No Trespass Letter on the female while she is still present outside. The letter was signed by the manager and served to the female by Officer Routhier. The female became very uncooperative and was shouting derogatory comments and using inappropriate language to the officer. Officer Routhier warned the female to lower her voice and leave the property. The female did not comply and she was arrested and charged with Disorderly Conduct and Fail to Obey a Lawful Order.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

Engineering

- Multiple permit reviews, underground locates, and service upgrade requests have been reviewed and/or completed by engineering staff.
- Engineering staff performed field staking of multiple overhead line improvements and extensions to improve service reliability and extend service to new industrial customers.
- The Staff Engineer continued review of Dissolved Gas Analysis data from oil filled HLD substation equipment. This data will tell us the health of our equipment and allow us to determine if repairs or replacement is needed to prevent failure of these devices.
- Engineering staff applied selective herbicide to HLD rights-of-way to control vertical growth species.
- The Staff Engineer prepared material bids for the installation of lighting and utility electric facilities along the extension of the City's Cultural Trail.
