2. **Wesel Boulevard.** The contractor has completed the road reconstruction and base paving for the entire length of the roadway, and has reopened all intersections to crossover traffic. Final surface paving is tentatively scheduled for the end of September and will be completed at night. Remaining work includes completion of the multi-use trail, installation of guiderail, and final grading of the shoulder areas.

3. **Skatepark.** Staff held a progress meeting with the designer. A pre-construction meeting will be held October 4th. Construction completion is now anticipated for April/May 2022 due to increase size and complexity.

4. **Panhandling Signal.** Staff is developing a work order for signs to encourage people to give to homeless services and not to panhandlers.

PLANNING & CODE ADMINISTRATION

New Development Cases: None.

Planning Commission: Special meeting was held on September 9. At this meeting, the Commission approved a site plan and subdivision plat for the enlargement of a parking lot at 1150 Professional Court. The Commission also approved forwarding the proposed amendments to the transportation element of the Comprehensive plan to the Maryland Department of Planning for the required 60 day review period. The Commission also discussed the results of the teleconference staff, city engineer, fire chief and Planning Commission chair had on September 3 with the planning director of Silver Spring Township, PA and the engineer for the "Walden" traditional neighborhood community. This was regarding the history of the development of Walden, it's various features, positive results and things the township and engineer would have, in retrospect, done differently. The next Planning Commission meeting will be held on Wednesday September 29, 2021 @ 7:00 pm.

Historic District Commission Agenda for September 9: The Commission dismissed as incomplete an application that has been continued over several past meetings for the replacement of a door that was removed without Commission approval at 247 South Prospect Street.

Board of Zoning Appeals: There is one item on the agenda for September 22. An appeal was filed with the BZA seeking review of the Zoning Administrator's determination that a drug treatment facility, or in the alternate, a post-treatment "large group" home – as proposed to be configured – are not permitted uses in the N-MU Zoning District, for the property a 670 Oak Hill Avenue. This was originally scheduled for the August hearing, but was postponed at the request of the applicant's legal counsel. This case has generated considerable public interest.

09/03/21: Officer Routhier responded to Summit Avenue for the report of a stolen package. The officer made contact with the caller and he advised that a white female stole a package from his business. The caller stated his package contained 3 rolls of vinyl worth over \$100. The caller was able to provide a video of the theft. The video clearly showed a white female approach the door, pick up the package, place it under her arm, and then walk away. A still image of the female was sent out to department personnel in an attempt to identify her. No further details are available.

09/04/21: Officer Williamson was dispatched to South Potomac Street for a report of vandalism of a vehicle. The complaint stated when she woke up on September 4, she observed that someone had damaged her vehicle with spray paint and flattened three of her tires. The victim advised her neighbors have cameras facing the street and she would check with them to see if the camera captured the incident. No additional information is available at this time.

09/05/21: Officer Williamson responded to Kuhn Avenue for a reported theft. The victim advised that someone had stolen his 10-foot orange aluminum step ladder from his property. The value of the ladder is \$200. The victim is remodeling his property and did not have any cameras that would have captured the theft. The victim stated he did have his name on the ladder. No further details are available.

09/06/21: Officer Wolfe was dispatched to North Mulberry Street for the report of two trespassing subjects. When the officer arrived, he found a male and female searching through and around a parked vehicle. The female stated she was there to pick up her vehicle she had parked in the alley way but the vehicle would not start. The officer conducted a Maryland registration check and the registration number returned to a different vehicle. The female stated she borrowed the vehicle from a friend and was not aware of the tag differences. The vehicle was currently unregistered and did not return as stolen. The female was unable to provide the name of her friend from whom she borrowed the vehicle. The vehicle was subsequently towed since it was unregistered and would not start. No further details are available.

09/07/21: Officer Filges responded to East Franklin Street for a report of a male that appeared to be under the influence of alcohol that fell off his bicycle. When the officer arrived on scene, Sergeant Knode was in conversation with the injured bike rider. Both Knode and Filges were familiar with the male since this is not his first incident riding a bike while intoxicated. It should be noted that the male has a habit of getting intoxicated and falling off his bicycle. On August 13, 2020, the same male was lying in the street after falling off his bicycle and was run over by a truck who was traveling on that roadway. Now in this incident, Sergeant Knode was attempting to handcuff the male when the male struck Sergeant Knode in the right shoulder. The male was treated for minor injuries resulting from his fall and then transported to Central Booking for processing the charge of Assault 2nd Degree on a police officer.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
