## ENGINEERING

1. **Wesel Boulevard.** The contractor is working to finish a median island in the middle of the roadway near the Wesel Storage Center, and is grading and placing topsoil in the shoulder areas. Work is also continuing on the multi-use path along the north side of the roadway. Weather permitting, the final surface pavement will be installed by mid-October.
2. **Urban Improvement Project.** Work continues on Hatter's Plaza, and final grading is underway along the District Court building in preparation for the installation of the trail pavers.
3. **MDOT Pre-Tour Meeting.** Staff participated in a virtual meeting with representatives of MDOT, SHA, Allegany County, Garrett County, and Washington County to prepare for the annual MDOT Tour Meeting where transportation projects in the region will be discussed with the Secretary of Transportation. The Washington County portion of the Tour will be held on October 7<sup>th</sup> at the Washington County Free Library.

## PLANNING & CODE ADMINISTRATION

**New Development Cases:** Site Plan for Higgins Property – Warehouse/Office

**Consultations:** Staff met with a representative of Richmond American Homes and their engineer regarding designs of a proposed subdivision on lands to be annexed into the city on the northern edge of the Hagers Crossing subdivision (south side of Broadfording Road). The development proposes 203 single-family detached dwellings, retention of an existing 200-year old stone dwelling on a lot to be created for it, 5 pocket parks and 1 central park/forest conservation area on 82 acres. Two hundred and three units on 82 acres is relatively low density by city standards. We have been advised to expect an annexation petition in about 4 to 6 weeks.

**Zoning Certificates Issued:** Vibez Lounge LLC (Bar/Restaurant) – 49 South Potomac Street

**Planning Commission:** Next PC meeting held is on September 29. Tentatively on the agenda at this time are:

- Begin review of the proposed 2021 Land Management Code annual package of updates.
- Site plan review for Modwash car wash on the site of the former Boston Market on Wesel Boulevard.
- Review of a sketch plan for a townhouse subdivision at the Brookmeadow site on the north side of Security Road.
- Review of a sketch plan for the creation of lots along previously platted streets on the portion of the Unger Property that is within the city, located on the eastern end of Armstrong Avenue, east of Virginia Avenue.

**Historic District Commission Agenda for September 23:** The HDC was scheduled to review two applications for replacement windows at 31 South Potomac Street and 441 North Potomac Street and for installation of an ornamental fence at 145-147 West Washington Street. Also, a workshop will be conducted regarding proposed rehabilitation of the Shockey Building at 26-30 Summit Avenue.

**Board of Zoning Appeals:** At its meeting on September 22, the Board heard an administrative appeal filed by Wells House regarding the zoning administrator's determination that the use proposed for the property at 670-672 Oak Hill Avenue (formerly "Bill's Other Yard Sale") is not permitted at that location in the N-MU District. Staff contended that the proposed use was a drug treatment facility (not a permitted use) and not a large group home or transitional housing unit (permitted use) in the N-MU District. Approximately 20 members of the public attended the hearing. The Board determined that the zoning administrator did not commit error in his determination and denied the appeal. Also, at this meeting the Board discussed its schedule for the 2022 calendar year, and permitted staff to explore changing the BZA's monthly meeting date from the third Wednesday to the second Thursday of the month (same as when the HDC meets at 4:30 p.m.) in order to improve staff efficiency in staffing after-hours board meetings. If this moves forward, the HDC would meet at 4:30 p.m. on the second Thursday (unchanged) and the Board of Zoning Appeals would meet at 7 p.m. on the same evening beginning in January.

**09/16/21:** Officer B. Decker responded to Park Place for a call regarding a stolen motor vehicle. The victim stated that her black Rogue had been stolen early in the morning. The victim stated that she had friends staying with her and the next morning the friends were gone and so were her car keys. The victim texted her friends about bringing the car back however she received no response. Nothing else from the property had been taken. No further details are available at this time.

**09/17/21:** Agent Isaacs and other members of the Hagerstown Police Department were dispatched to Main Avenue for shots fired. Upon arrival, Agent Isaacs determined the incident took place in the 1000 block of Lanvale Street. Several individuals were in the street looking for items on the ground. One of the individuals stated he found a shell casing. Agent Isaacs ordered everyone off the street. A by-stander stated she observed an older model Chevy Blazer in the 1000 block of Lanvale Street when the driver stuck

his hand out the window and began firing in the air. Agent Isaacs collected five shell casings on Lanvale Street. No further details are available.

**09/18/21:** Officer B. Decker responded to a call on Chestnut Street regarding a parking complaint. The officer observed a motorcycle that was parked in the middle of the alley and was blocking traffic. The officer pushed the motorcycle from the alley way and called a tow truck for assistance. The VIN returned with no owner and no registration. The motorcycle is secured in Nextow's impound lot. A hold card was submitted to HPD for proof of ownership on the motorcycle.

**09/19/21:** Sergeant Cox was dispatched to East Antietam Street for a report of malicious destruction of property. Contact was made with the caller and she stated that a female, who is known to her, and an unknown male were seated on her porch. The male and female were yelling and having a vulgar conversation. The caller asked them to move from her porch when the female became irate. The female picked up a brick and threw it through the caller's window causing glass to shatter both inside and outside the residence. Sergeant Cox will be filing charges against the female.

**09/20/21:** Officer G. Anderson responded to Virginia Avenue for a follow up to a prior theft. The victim stated that his credit cards were stolen and he believes the suspects may be guests that he allowed to stay with him. Over the past several weeks the victim has also noticed items missing from his residence. The victim is suspicious that the guests made a duplicate of his house key and are entering the home when he is not there. He has since changed his locks. The items are valued at approximately \$300. No further details are available.

**PRESS RELEASE**

On September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at 5:47 a.m. HPD responded to 201 East Franklin Street for a reported shooting. Upon arrival, Officers located a male who had been shot. Officers began first aid until EMS arrived and took the victim to Meritus Medical Center. Shortly after arrival at Meritus Medical Center, the victim, Donovan Ahmod Disney, was pronounced dead. Detectives were called to the scene and began an investigation into the homicide.

Through investigation, Detectives learned that Miquan Rashad Broadus shot Disney during a dispute inside a residence. Detectives executed a search and seizure warrant at 201 East Franklin Street, Apt. #6, where the shooting occurred and also where Broadus was living. Broadus had fled the scene prior to Officers arrival. At this time there is an active arrest warrant for Miquan Rashad Broadus. The Hagerstown Police Department is currently offering a monetary reward for information leading to the arrest of Broadus.

**UPDATE:** On September 21, 2021 at approximately 3 a.m., the Hagerstown Police Department was contacted by Washington D.C. Metro Police Department in reference to this case. D.C. Metro Police advised that Miquan Broadus was in custody after being shot several times by an unknown suspect within their jurisdiction. Broadus is currently in an undisclosed medical facility at this time.




