## PLANNING & CODE ADMINISTRATION

**New Development Cases:** A sketch plan received for the redevelopment of the HHA "Noland Village" development. It will be known as "Martin Heights", and will involve razing about 2/3 of the existing buildings, major rehabilitation of the remainder, new construction of two multi-family buildings and a new community center, with remaining lands held in reserve for future redevelopment.

**Planning Commission:** On September 29, the Commission took the following actions:

- Approved a site plan and three design waivers for AutoSpa car wash on the site of the former Boston Market on Wesel Boulevard.
  
- Approved a sketch plan for a 118-lot townhouse subdivision at the Brook Meadow site on the north side of Security Road.
  
- Approved a sketch plan for the creation of 36 single-family lots, one open space lot and a stormwater management lot in the area east of Virginia Avenue at the city line where existing street rights of way extensions (created in 1966) for Moller Avenue, Armstrong Avenue and Marion Street.
  
- Deferred starting review of the annual text amendment package until the next meeting. The next meeting will be on October 13.

**Historic District Commission Agenda for September 23:** No activity at this time. The next meeting will be held October 14.

**Board of Zoning Appeals:** The Board's October 20 agenda has one case scheduled. The owner of 1459 Potomac Avenue (corner of Northern Avenue, across from the old Sears building), has filed a request for a change of a non-conforming use to change the use from an outpatient medical facility (doctor's office) to an office for a financial management business.

### REPORTS

**09/23/21:** Officer Zupan and Officer Cramer responded to the wooded area along the northwest corner of the Quality Inn located on the Dual Highway. It should be noted this is a common area for homeless encampments and a site where CDS is used. While checking the area, Officer Cramer located an All Terrain Vehicle in the wooded area which had been hidden behind some small shrubbery. Officer Cramer attempted to read the VIN but the VIN was scratched over. Officer Cramer took a photo of the ATV and showed to employees of the Quality Inn to see if they had seen this vehicle. No employee had seen this ATV in the area. Reliable Tow towed the ATV to HPD for safe keeping. No further details are available.

**09/24/21:** Officer Wheat was dispatched to Penny Mart on West Washington Street for a report of a robbery involving a gun. An employee stated a white male dressed in a dark colored, hooded sweatshirt and dark sweatpants, entered the store and demanded \$20 from the cash drawer. The male implied he had a gun under his shirt. The employee gave the male the \$20 and the male placed the bills in his left pocket and fled the area. Officer Wheat notified other officers of the robbery and gave description of the suspect. Approximately 15 minutes later, Sergeant Knode observed a male walking downtown that matched the description of the suspect. The male was detained and the employee made a positive identification that the detained male was the same individual that robbed the store. No weapon was found on his person. The suspect was transported to Central Booking and charged with Robbery and other related charges.

**09/25/21:** Officer B. Decker responded to an incident at the County Commuter bus stop on West Franklin Street. At the bus stop a male got into an argument with a passenger who then punched him in the face. The male began screaming profanities at the pedestrians. The bus driver then called for police assistance. The male was identified and ordered to stop screaming and causing a public disturbance or he would be arrested and taken to jail. He did calm down and the officer left the scene. About one hour later, this same male was in another incident where he was allegedly punching citizens outside of Roy Rogers Restaurant on Burhans Boulevard. The male was arrested for disorderly conduct.

**09/28/21:** Officer White was dispatched to the Washington County Library on South Potomac Street for a subject trespassing. The library security guard stated there was a male in the library that had already been served a No Trespass Letter which barred him from entering the library building. The officer did confirm there was an active No Trespass Letter on file at HPD for this male. The officer located the male on the third floor restroom at which time he was arrested.

### **OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION**

**Congratulations to Officer Jay McNew.** Master Police Officer Jay McNew has been selected as Officer of the Month for August 2021. Officer McNew has been employed by the City of Hagerstown for 14 years and is assigned to the Patrol Division.

Officer McNew was nominated by one of his supervisors for an incident that occurred in August 2021, where officers responded for a female who was threatening via text message to jump off a balcony with her juvenile son. When officers arrived, they located the female standing on the balcony of the residence with her son. Officer McNew arrived and attempted to talk to the female but had difficulty communicating due to a noisy outdoor environment. He was eventually able to convince the female to agree to talk to him by telephone to allow for better communication. After some negotiations, Officer McNew was able to convince the female to open her door to allow officers to come into her residence to check on the wellbeing of her son. Once inside the residence and with the assistance of family and friends, Officer McNew and other officers were able to convince the female to go to the hospital to speak with professional counselors. Based on his calm demeanor and excellent communication skills, Master Police Officer Jay McNew was able to de-escalate a potentially volatile situation with a safe resolution for all parties involved. Because of his actions, Master Police Officer Jay McNew has been chosen as Officer of the Month for August 2021. The Hagerstown Police Department is proud to have dedicated officers such as Officer McNew as one of its own and congratulates him for a job well done.



**CHART NO. 1 – GENERAL PARKING SYSTEM DATA**


