PLANNING & CODE ADMINISTRATION

New Development Cases: Subdivision plat was received for the first 107 lots at Kilpatrick Woods (between Marshall Street and Salem Avenue, west of Rhode Island Avenue). Plat was received for the last section of the Hagers Crossing PUD.

Consultations: Staff met with an engineer retained by the owner of the Haven Road tract to discuss designs of a subdivision of single family homes and townhomes on this tract. Staff will begin discussions with the Planning Commission on Wednesday regarding the 2021 annual Land Management Code amendment package, in which certain minor adjustments to the subdivision regulations are proposed to more positively promote more traditional urban subdivision designs. Staff will meet with the new owners of the former Surrey School property regarding a potential conversion overlay district to rehabilitate the building for use as a boutique hotel.

Historic District Commission: No applications were received for the next meeting.

Zoning Certificates Issued: R& M Collision Repair-Automotive Glass and Autobody Repair.

Planning Commission: Begins discussions on the 2021 annual package of Land Management Code amendments. The package is expected to be smaller than last year's offering. No plan review appears to be ready for next week's meeting at this time.

REPORTS

09/30/21: Officers from HPD were informed by the Emergency Communications Center that a subject was stabbed in the area of Jonathan Street. The injured subject was located and suffered a laceration to his abdominal area, left forearm and right hand. The subject was transported to Meritus Medical Center. The victim's injuries were determined to be non-life threatening. Officer St.Clair began reviewing City cameras in the area and the incident was captured on camera. The suspect has been identified and charges are forthcoming.

10/01/21: Officer Zupan and Officer McDermott responded to Sheetz on Eastern Boulevard for a report of a disturbance inside the store. The officers located the victim and she stated she was using the ATM machine and a black female was in line behind her. When the victim's money came out of the machine the female behind tried to grab the money. The victim tried to hold on to the money but the suspect punched the victim in the face and upper body. During the incident another female joined in on the assault. The females were able to grab some of the victim's money and they fled in a silver Mitsubishi. One of the suspect's was identified by her Maryland tag number. The investigation is on-going.

10/03/21: Officer Reese was dispatched to Potomac Street in reference to a found child. The small child in a diaper was attempting to cross the intersection. A passer-by observed the situation and took the child to safety. The child had no bruises or injuries to indicate child neglect. The child was transported to HPD. Minutes later someone called 911 to report his 3 year old son was missing from the house. The caller arrived at HPD and claimed his son. The father stated he just got home from work and his wife was asleep due to her medication making her drowsy. The father searched the house for his son and then called 911. The father mentioned the child had just learned how to open the lock on the door. The incident was reported to the Child Protective Services and a safety plan was put into action.

10/06/21: Officer Morris received a phone call at the HPD Watch Center in regards to a theft from a motor vehicle. The victim stated someone had taken his backpack from his 2018 Ford which was parked on Salem Avenue. Apparently, the vehicle had been left unsecured since there were no signs of forced entry. The victim was able to locate his backpack in a dumpster close to Roy Rogers Restaurant on Burhans Boulevard. His wallet was in the backpack but all his money and cards had been removed. The victim was advised to call his bank and cancel his cards. No further details are available.

PRESS RELEASES.

On October 1st at approximately 11:43 p.m., Officers responded to Funkhouser Park at 570 Jefferson Boulevard for a 911 hang up call. Upon arrival officers located a female deceased in the Park close to Jefferson Boulevard. Detectives were called to the scene and she was identified as Amy Lynn Heath, a 37 year old female from Hagerstown Maryland. Through investigation, detectives learned that Heath was possibly in the company of a black male wearing unknown dark clothing. The black male is described as approximately 5'6", 150 pounds and was pushing a hotel luggage cart in the area of Jefferson Boulevard and Cleveland Avenue. At the time of her death, Heath was wearing white shoes, white jeans and a black shirt. Heath's body was sent to the office of the Medical Examiner. At this time, her death is considered suspicious and this is an active investigation. Detectives are asking anyone who may have seen Heath or the above-described black male on Friday October, 2021 to contact the Hagerstown Police Department Criminal Investigations Division at 301-790-3700, Ext 234.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
