REPORTS

10/14/21: Officer Perez Velez was dispatched to Little Elliot Drive for a male that was yelling, breaking walls, and threatening neighbors with a pipe. The caller advised the officer that the male, who is his neighbor, had threatened him. The officer advised the caller to go inside his residence. Officer Perez Velez and Sergeant Leeney attempted numerous times to calm the male. The male did not comply and was placed under arrest and transported to Central Booking. No further details are available.

10/15/21: Officer Nichols responded to Byers Stop N Go on North Burhans Boulevard for a trespassing complaint. An employee of the business advised the officer that a male who was at the store had previously been served with a letter of no trespass. The officer asked the male if he was aware that he had an active letter of no trespass for Byers Stop N Go. The male responded he was aware of the active letter however he just wanted a piece of cheesecake from the store. The male was arrested. It should be noted that a used glass smoking device and copper wire were found in the male's left pant pocket. These items are typically used for ingestion of a controlled dangerous substance. The male was transported to Central Booking and charged with Trespassing Private Property.

10/17/21: Officer Williamson was dispatched to Virginia Avenue for a reported physical disturbance which resulted in a male bleeding from the head. Upon arrival, the victim advised the officer that he had come to visit a friend who was going to give him a haircut. After the haircut, two black males, who were inside the residence, approached him and claimed he disrespected their uncle. He victim stated he was then pistol whipped and robbed of his wallet. The suspects fled the area and the victim attempted to chase them. One of the suspects fired two shots at the victim but the victim was not harmed. The incident was captured on a surveillance camera and the video was submitted into evidence at HPD. The officer did find one spent 9mm brass shell casing in a nearby yard. No further details are available.

10/18/21: Officers made contact with a female who stated she had just been raped by two males from the Cold Weather Shelter. The female was transported to Meritus Medical Center for treatment. Officer Reese went to Meritus to gather additional information from the victim. The victim stated a dark colored vehicle pulled into the parking lot of the shelter. Since she knew the males in the vehicle who were from the shelter, she entered the vehicle. She was under the impression they would be going to purchase some drugs. However, upon entering the vehicle she was threatened with a knife and told to remove her clothing. She did what she was told and was sexually assaulted by both males. A female approached the vehicle irate because the males had sold her fake CDS and she wanted her money back. The female jumped on the vehicle hitting and kicking the windshield. The males exited the vehicle to address the issue with the female. At this point the victim was able to flee from the vehicle and get help. This case has been forwarded to the Criminal Investigative Unit. The investigation is on-going.

10/20/21: Officer R. Dean responded to Westside Avenue for a reported stabbing of a male. The officer located the victim in the kitchen and he was suffering from stabs to the right arm. The officer applied a towel to the arm to help stop the bleeding until medical help arrived. Officer C. Kelly arrived on the scene and found other stab wounds on the chest and back of the victim. The victim advised officers he allowed a homeless male to spend the night at his residence. The victim did not know this male's last name but knew he would always hang out at Byers Stop N Go. The next morning, he saw the male attempting to take money from his wallet which led to a physical altercation. During this altercation the victim was stabbed several times by the homeless male. The homeless male left the residence when the victim realized he had been stabbed. The suspect is described as a light skinned male, approximately 6 feet tall and 275 pounds. The victim's injuries were not life threatening, but did require surgery. No further details are available.

PRESS RELEASES

On 10/19/21 at approximate 3 a.m., officers approached a vehicle parked in the 200 block of North Jonathan Street. The vehicle had three occupants, all of whom were sleeping in the car. Through investigation officers were able to get probable cause to search the vehicle. As officers ordered everyone out of the car, the driver fled on foot and was apprehended a short time later. The search resulted in approximately 300 capsules that contained suspected crack cocaine and the seizure of over \$2,800 which is believed to be proceeds from the sale of the narcotics. The street value of the remaining capsules is approximately \$6,000. Taariq Roberts, age 32 of Hagerstown, was placed in to custody and charged with the following: CDS Possession with the Intent to Distribute Narcotics CDS Possession, Large Amount CDS Possession, Not Marijuana Common Nuisance Distributing Narcotic.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY


