DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

1. **HYC:** The Hagerstown Youth Council met on Monday, October 25th with City Engineer Rodney Tissue to discuss community concerns and future projects
2. **Events:** Downtown Hagerstown Halloween Block Party | Saturday, October 30, 5-9 p.m. | South Potomac Street, between Washington and Antietam Streets. Activities include trick or treating, costume contests, DJ, live music, BISFA performance and more!

ENGINEERING

1. **Speed Study of Dual Highway.** Staff attended a meeting with State Highway and Hagerstown Eastern Panhandle Metropolitan Planning Organization officials to discuss how to make the Dual Highway safer for pedestrians between Cannon Avenue and Cleveland Avenue. Pedestrian traffic in that area has quadrupled in the last three years. The study will conclude early next year.
2. **Wheaton Park.** Three concepts were presented at the public meeting on Wednesday night. Though lightly attended, we made some progress and eliminated one concept. We will present these to the City Council in November.
3. **"Be Colorblind" Mural Replacement.** The Public Art Commission reviewed nine submittals to create a new mural to replace the deteriorated mural. A finalist was selected and will be presented to City Council in November.
4. **Electronics Recycling.** Event is Saturday, November 6th at the Municipal Stadium.

Historic District Commission: The following items are on the Commission's agenda for its meeting on October 28:

Workshop for Ugo Management regarding renovations to the Shockey Building on the east side of Summit Avenue, demolition of adjacent two-story building and construction of an addition to the Shockey Building where the to-be-demolished building is currently located.

Planning Commission: At its regular meeting on October 27, the Planning Commission held a workshop with David Lyles and David Trostle (Frederick, Seibert and Associates) regarding a proposed townhouse development on the "Reese Farm", located in an RH (Residential High Density) Zoning District on land between Hebb Road and Emmert Road. The Commission then reviewed revised drafts of proposals for the 2021 package of Land Management Code amendments. The official package will be presented to the Planning Commission for approval to forward to public meeting at its meeting on November 10. Public review meeting will be scheduled for the Commission's December meeting.

Board of Zoning Appeals: At its meeting on October 20, the Board approved the change of a nonconforming use from an ambulatory health care facility (doctor's office) to a financial services office at 1459 Potomac Avenue (corner of Northern Avenue, across from the former Sears Building).

REPORTS

10/22/21: Officer Wheat responded to West Franklin Street for the report of a theft. The victim stated he was in front of the 7-Star Mini Mart on West Franklin Street when he was jumped by five black males. One of the males swung a black machete at him but did not make contact. The other males began punching and kicking him until he fell to the ground. The male suspects ransacked his pockets and stole his cash and his black Samsung cell phone. The victim was transported to Meritus Medical Center by the Community Rescue Service. Officer Daveler reviewed the City cameras in the area of the incident and was unable to observe the alleged robbery. No further details are available.

10/23/21: Officer Cramer was patrolling the area of Walnut Street when he observed a gold Ford Taurus that had a right front headlight out. Officer Cramer conducted a traffic stop at West Antietam Street. As the officer was exiting his cruiser, the Ford Taurus sped away. Officer Cramer returned to his cruiser and followed the Ford Taurus to Roy Rogers Restaurant on Burhans Boulevard. The officer learned that the driver was driving on a suspended and revoked license in the State of Maryland. The driver received several traffic citations and the vehicle was towed by Wrenches and Wreckers Tow Company. No further details are available.

10/25/21: Officer L. Dean responded to West Antietam Street for a reported child abuse. The caller advised the officer that his son had just returned from visiting his mother who lives on North Locust Street. The four year old child had bruises to his facial area which included his left eye, left ear, center forehead and right cheek. The child stated that his mother's boyfriend hit him and he tumbled down the steps. The officer took photos and contacted Child Protective Services about the incident. No further details are available at this time.

10/26/21: Officer Thompson was dispatched to Salem Avenue for the report of a burglary in progress. Upon arrival, the officer observed the front window was open and the screen was ripped. A neighbor reported to the officer that this house had been abandoned for many years and the inside is in poor condition. The officer saw a male walk out on the rear porch. The male advised he was inside the house to stay out of the bad weather. The officer recognized the male from previous encounters with HPD. The officer was unable to locate the owner of the property. Charges are forth coming for the male.

10/27/21: The Watch Center received a call from a victim who wanted to report that someone had taken a laptop and other items from her vehicle parked on North Mulberry Street. The laptop belongs to Walter Reed Hospital who is her employer. The officer found no cameras in the area of the incident. The laptop was entered into NCIC as stolen. No further details are available.

PRESS RELEASES

Two Indicted by Grand Jury for Death of 9 Month Old. In April of 2021, Officers responded to the 300 block of South Mulberry Street for an unresponsive baby. Officers immediately began CPR and the child was taken to Meritus Medical Center. Life-saving efforts continued at the hospital but unfortunately the nine month old female was pronounced deceased. The child's body was sent to the Office of the Medical Examiner in Baltimore for autopsy. An investigation by HPD detectives was immediately opened.

The investigation spanned several months while investigators waited on the autopsy results. The results were returned from the Medical Examiner's Office on October 6th of 2021. The report listed the baby's cause of death as "complications of malnutrition" and "neglect." Manner of death is listed as homicide. In accordance with these results and with evidence gathered during the investigation, the case was presented to the Grand Jury of Washington County on 10/19/21. Ashley Nicole Franklin (mother) age 34 of Hagerstown and William Antonio Conyers (father), age 27 of Hagerstown, were indicted on the following charges which were determined with the assistance of the Washington County's State's Attorney's Office.

Charges against Ashley Nicole Franklin: Franklin as arrested on 10/25/21 and is charged with 1st Degree Child Abuse (Death) 1st Degree Child Abuse (Severe Physical Injury) Involuntary Manslaughter Neglect of a Minor.

Charges against William Antonio Conyers: Conyers has been charged with 1st Degree Child Abuse (Sever Physical Injury) Neglect of a Minor. He has not yet been located and arrested. We are seeking the public's assistance as to his whereabouts. Anyone with information can contact Detective Fleegal at fleegal@hagerstownpd.org or call 240-313-4345 to immediately report Conyers.

Two other children, ages 6 and 13, belonging to Franklin were removed from the home at the time of the child's death. They were placed with appropriate family members and were in good health. HPD would like to thank the Department of Social Services and the Child Advocacy Center for their assistance with this case.

Congratulations to Officer Kirsten Dailey. Kirsten Dailey is now a sworn police officer. She met all State and local requirements to become a Hagerstown Police officer. She was sworn-in Thursday, October 28 in Council Chambers at City Hall. Officer Dailey is now ready to begin her Field Training Program. We wish her much success as she pursues her law enforcement career.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
