Main Street:



REPORTS

11/04/21: Officer Dailey was dispatched to Jonathan Street for a burglary. The complainant was a maintenance worker for Bethel Gardens. He stated he was working on an apartment on Wednesday, November 3rd, and when he returned on Thursday, November 4th, the front door had been forced open. There was damage to the door frame and the door could not function in its designed manner. Officers Routhier and Dailey reviewed HPD cameras and observed two people go to the basement apartment. Detective Brashears will be handling the investigation.

11/06/21: Officer Main responded to Hamilton Boulevard for a reported death. Officers estimated the person to have been deceased for approximately a week. Neighbors advised that the deceased's moped was not on the scene so they believed he was not home. The sister of the deceased stated that her brother would not have loaned his moped to anyone and therefore believed his moped had been stolen. The Kymco moped was entered into NCIC as stolen. No further details are available at this time.

11/07/21: Officer Williamson was dispatched to Murph Avenue for a reported vehicle theft. The caller stated she loaned her vehicle to her ex-boyfriend last month and he refused to return the vehicle to her. The Chevrolet Suburban was entered as stolen into the NCIC system. No further information is available.

11/08/21: Officer G. Anderson was traveling on West Irvin when he was flagged down by several walkers. They advised there was a Volkswagen Passat nearby that have not been moved for several months. The Volkswagen Passat was showing expired West Virginia tags. The officer found no one inside the vehicle. The vehicle was towed by Blue Gray and towed off the city street. A hold was placed on the vehicle for current registration and proof of ownership. No further details are available at this time.

11/09/21: Officer Routhier responded to South Locust Street for an assault in progress. The officer made contact with the caller who advised that her son had gotten jumped in the 300 block of South Potomac Street. The victim then advised that he was walking home when some individuals ran up behind him and pushed him down. While on the ground they kicked him on the right side of his face and rib cage. Officer Routhier checked city cameras in the 300 block of South Potomac Street and observed a group of five black juveniles walk from Locust Point to Potomac Liquors. A still image was sent out to department personnel in an attempt to identify the suspects. No further details are available at this time.

PRESS RELEASES

On November 9, 2021, officers responded to the area of 1052 Noland Drive for a report of a disturbance involving a handgun. On arrival, a male later identified as Justin Carattini, age 26 from Astonia, NY, fled from officers on foot. Officers on scene, with assistance from Deputies with the Washington County Sheriff's Office were able to place Carattini in custody. He had a fully loaded revolver in his waistband. The gun returned as stolen out of Pennsylvania. Carattini is currently being held at the Washington County Detention Center and is charged with the following weapons offenses: Possession of Stolen Firearm, Concealed Dangerous Weapon, Handgun on Person and Loaded Handgun on Person.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
