


**Categories of Conditions**

Safety	Conditions which are or reasonably present a hazard to occupant or public. <u>Example:</u> No smoke alarms, improper wiring, handrails
Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property <u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration. <u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance. <u>Examples:</u> Uses not permitted in property's zone, construction of new facilities, follow up inspections on open violations.

**Officer of the Month:** Officer Ryan Wertz has been selected as Officer of the Month for January 2022. Officer Wertz worked on two separate robbery cases where he ensured that suspects were identified and appropriately charged. The first case occurred on January 12<sup>th</sup> where a subject was confronted inside a convenience store bathroom. The suspect demanded money while displaying a knife. The two became involved in a physical altercation and the victim was stabbed in the hand. Officer Wertz followed up with the victim, reviewed store surveillance footage and was able to both identify and charge the suspect in this case. The second case occurred on January 18<sup>th</sup> at a residence in the 500 block of Frederick Street. A female victim was physically assaulted by two subjects and robbed of cash. The victim in this case was visibly upset and had red marks around her neck due to one of the subjects choking her. Officer Wertz was able to identify, interview and then charge both of the suspects involved in this incident. We are appreciative of Officer Wertz and his follow through and investigative skills. The Hagerstown Police Department is proud to have him as a dedicated member of this agency and congratulate him for a job well done.

**2021 Officer of the Year:** Officer Travis Wheat has been selected as 2021 Officer of the Year. Officer Wheat had 102 arrests and was among the top leaders in traffic enforcement. During the year, he recovered seven handguns resulting in felony charges, all on prohibited persons. He also recovered an eighth handgun from a convenience store following an assault with the same gun.

Officer Wheat has less than one year as a sworn officer and in that time took it upon himself to be proactive and ask questions. He was eager to learn and took on new challenges and duties with enthusiasm. He approached both proactive and routine police work with professionalism, a true reflection on our agency.

Of note, Officer Wheat did excellent work following a homicide that occurred in October. Officers responded to the 200 block of North Mulberry Street for a reported shooting. Upon arrival, a victim was found with a gunshot wound to his leg. A second victim was found with a gunshot wound to his chest and did not survive his injuries. Later that night, video surveillance of the shooting suspect and two others with him at the time was forwarded to all HPD personnel for identification. Within minutes, Officer Wheat responded to the email identifying the shooter as an individual with whom he was familiar through previous contacts. Additional video surveillance of better quality was later located and viewed by Officer Wheat who verified being 100% positive the identification of the shooter. This identification by Officer Wheat assisted in establishing probable cause for an arrest warrant with charges of First Degree Murder. Additionally, this information was also crucial in establishing probable cause to support a search and seizure warrant at the suspect's residence that yielded items of evidential value to the case. Within two hours of the learning this information, the suspect was taken into custody by the Manatee County (FL) Sheriff's Office and is currently awaiting trial.

During 2021, Officer Wheat worked in conjunction with several other officers on Baker shift on enforcement details. They encouraged one another and together they built a team mentality. His energy and positive attitude was crucial in increasing productivity and morale on the shift. While he himself was in the learning process, he helped other officers learn and grow throughout the year.

Officer Wheat's reports were submitted promptly and his detailed report writing skills led to multiple preliminary hearings being waived by defense attorneys. The Hagerstown Police Department is grateful for Officer Wheat's work and look forward to his growth in this profession.



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
