Economic Development.

- Hagerstown Community College (HCC) - Staff attended a Pit Session at the HCC Fletcher Incubator + Labs to present City incentives and opportunities to connect.

Hagerstown Youth Council. The Hagerstown Youth Council met on Monday, February 7th to discuss upcoming community projects including the annual Earth Day and Arbor Day celebration.

- Staff attended a virtual training conference held by HUD for the CDBG program on various topics including administrative monitoring, small business assistance, and reporting.
- The application period for annual CDBG public service grants closed on January 7, 2022. Staff received a total of eight applications. The applications will now be reviewed by both a staff team and the CDBG Citizen Advisory Council.
- The CDBG Microenterprise Grant program is currently accepting applications from eligible small businesses (classified as having five or fewer employees). To date 10 businesses have received funding through the program for various expenses including rent, working capital, and new equipment. Interested businesses are advised to visit the City's website to complete a prescreen questionnaire.

ENGINEERING

1. **Memorandum of Understanding for Cultural Trail.** Staff continues to work with our attorneys to finalize our comments on this document based on the guidance from City Council. The Maryland Stadium Authority has selected a design/build team for the stadium and it will be made public on March 9th.
2. **Fire Station on South Potomac Street.** Triad Engineering completed additional field testing to quantify the contamination area. The report is due in a couple weeks.
3. **Highland Avenue Drainage.** As requested by the Museum of Fine Arts, we bid a small contract to prevent runoff from Highland Avenue from impacting their building. Nine bids were received and we will issue a PO soon.
4. **Skatepark.** Construction has finally begun and the ground breaking ceremony is Tuesday, March 1st at 2 p.m.

REPORTS:

- On Monday, February 14th at approximately 12:30 a.m., officers conducted a traffic stop in 600 block of West Franklin Street. Antoine Malone of Hagerstown was identified as the passenger. During the course of the stop, a loaded handgun was recovered under the passenger seat where Malone had been sitting. This gun is what is commonly referred to as a "ghost gun." They are assembled from parts that do not have serial numbers and bought on the internet without a background check. Malone is prohibited from carrying a firearm based on two prior convictions, including a previous handgun in vehicle charge. He is currently still on parole. Malone has been charged with numerous charges including the following: Handgun in Vehicle; Firearm-Possession with Felony Conviction; Regulated Firearm-Illegal Possession; Loaded Handgun in Vehicle.

MEDIA RELEASES:

- On Thursday, February 10th at approximately 4:05 p.m. officers responded to the 300 block of the Dual Highway for a report of a shooting that had just occurred. Responding officers located a male victim suffering from a non-life-threatening gunshot wound to the foot. Investigation revealed that the victim had been walking in the area of the Dual Highway when he was approached by several unidentified subjects. After exchanging words, one of the subjects produced a handgun and shot the victim in the foot prior to fleeing the scene. The victim was transported to Meritus Medical Center for treatment of his injury. The suspects are believed to be three males in their late teens or early twenties wearing dark clothing. It is not believed that there is any larger threat to the public at this time. Anyone with information on this incident is asked to contact Det. CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
