**Officer of the Month.** Officer Tim Cramer has been selected as Officer of the Month for February. On February 14<sup>th</sup>, Officer Cramer conducted a business check at 152 North Burhans Boulevard. While inside, he recognized an individual with an extensive criminal history with the Hagerstown Police Department. This individual began to behave suspiciously. After the individual left the store, Ofc. Cramer was able to make a traffic stop on the vehicle the individual was riding in. During the course of the stop, Ofc. Cramer recovered a loaded handgun under the suspect's seat. The individual is prohibited from possessing a firearm due in part to a previous handgun conviction. He was charged with numerous handgun violations and subsequently held without bond at the Washington County Detention Center.

Ofc. Cramer's keen observation skills and proactive police work led to this arrest and another illegal handgun off the streets of Hagerstown. The Hagerstown Police Department is proud to have him as a dedicated member of this agency. We congratulate him for a job well done.



**CHART NO. 1 – GENERAL PARKING SYSTEM DATA**


