MEDIA RELEASES

- **Home Invasion:** On March 7, 2022, officers responded to a residence on Marshall Street. On arrival, they found a 95 year-old woman with injuries to her head, neck, and face. The victim told officers that a male had come in to her home and tried to kill her. The elderly woman was transported to Meritus Medical Center and HPD investigators arrived on scene. Detectives determined that the victim recently had home health care assistance come to the residence. Angel Marie Parker began assisting in the home and became aware of a large sum of cash that the victim kept. HPD is alleging that Parker then coordinated a plan with Jacob Benjamin Kitch-Nordsick and Taylor Paul Alexander to steal the money. It is believed that one or more suspects entered the home on the night of 3/7/22, physically assaulted the victim, and stole the cash. The victim is believed to have been knocked unconscious and strangled. When she came to, she was on the floor, the suspects were gone, and she was able to use her home health alert necklace to alert 911 that she needed assistance. The victim has since been treated and released.

We are extremely grateful that this brave woman was not more seriously injured or killed. HPD would like to acknowledge responding officers, EMT's that provided initial treatment and the swift work of HPD detectives. All three subjects have been arrested and are being held without bond. This remains an open investigation to ensure no other parties were involved or if other charges are appropriate. The following charges apply:

- Angel Marie Parker, age 33, Hagerstown: Attempted 1st and 2nd Murder; Home Invasion; Strong Armed Robbery; 1st and 2nd Degree Assault; 3rd and 4th Degree Burglary; Theft
- Jacob Benjamin Kitch-Nordsick, age 23, No Fixed Address: Attempted 1st and 2nd Murder; Home Invasion; Strong Armed Robbery; 1st and 2nd Degree Assault; 3rd and 4th Degree Burglary; Theft
- Taylor Paul Alexander, age 23, No Fixed Address: Home Invasion; 1st and 2nd Degree Assault; 1st and 4th Degree Burglary; Robbery; Theft

Scooter Accident: On 3/14/22 at approximately 6 p.m., officers were in the area of Jonathan and Bethel Streets where they observed a male on a motor scooter on West Bethel Street. The male drove onto the sidewalk and traveled south bound along North Jonathan Street. A police car subsequently pulled onto the sidewalk and struck the motor scooter. The operator of the motor scooter, a 34 year-old male from Hagerstown, was transported to Meritus Medical Center with a non-life threatening leg injury. The officer involved is on administrative suspension while the incident is investigated. More updates will be given as appropriate. The incident was captured on Hagerstown City surveillance cameras. A secondary email will be sent from evidence.com to this media group containing a link to street camera video of the incident.

Shooting Incident: On 3/17/22 at about 4 p.m., officers responded to the area of Alexander and Dale Streets for a report of a gunshot victim. On arrival, officers located a male with multiple gunshot wounds. He was transported to Meritus Medical Center where he was later pronounced deceased. The victim is identified as Jermaine Reed II, age 27 of Hagerstown.

We have recovered a white Honda Accord that was involved in the incident and it is currently being processed for evidence. This is an active homicide investigation and there is no further information to be released to the public at this time.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Monday, March 7, 2022 @ 5 PM: Dispatch called to report a pallet and debris in the roadway at Eastern Boulevard near Sheetz. Items were placed by the side of street and collected the next business day morning.

Thursday, March 20, 2022 @ 3:10 PM: Staff received a report of a loose drain lid at southbound Virginia Avenue at the end of median. Staff investigated and found the lid loose but secure. They did observe damaged concrete but it did not compromise the structural integrity of drain.

Friday, March 11, 2022 @ 4:15PM: Report of stuck pocket door at customer service area 1st floor at City Hall. Door would not open or close, roller track was completely separated from door. Staff closed door using pry bar to lock for the day.

Saturday, March 12, 2022 @ 1:30 PM: Reports of intersection in active flash at Burhans/Church/Salem. Staff investigated and found compromised conductors due to an underground damaged conduit. Conductors from other phases were diverted to accommodate the failed wiring and signal operated properly.

Sunday, March 13, 2022 @ 12:30 PM: Dispatch called for treatment of icy conditions at Potomac Walk from the A&E Parking Deck to South Potomac Street. Staff found water falling from gutter of 28 South Potomac Street causing the sidewalk to ice over to the curb line. The area was treated with salt and some ice was shoveled off.

WEATHER. A full crew and contractor were working what was hopefully the last storm for the season. "Quinlan" started at 4:30 AM and ended by 12:15 PM Saturday, March 12th and brought 4.6" of snow followed by a hard freeze that evening. About 150 tons of salt were used to treat the streets.


