

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Economic Development. Staff attended the 2022 MEDA Chesapeake Basic Economic Development Course, which is the first step of becoming a Certified Economic Developer (CEcD).

Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations. Staff attended the Grand Opening of BEACON House Inc.'s Lil' STEAMERS program at 382 South Cleveland Avenue. Growing quickly with the expansion of their services, the organization recently opened its new childcare center focused on early learning for children as young as six weeks to four years old. Seeking to provide high quality infant, toddler, and preschool care, BEACON House are committed to facilitating a strong start to learning with their Lil' STEAMERS program.

ENGINEERING

1. **Professional Court.** The County received construction bids on Wednesday. The City's share of Concrete General's low bid is approximately \$3.2 million. This funding allocation will be on the August 9, 2022 Special Session.
2. **Entrance Building at Fairgrounds Park.** Work is substantially complete and the Maryland Historic Trust inspected the project and only a short punch list remains. A new "Character Counts" banner was donated and installed.



3. **Former Sears Building.** Staff met on site with developers and property owners regarding a traffic study and planning process to remove the former department store and construct a convenience store.
4. **Solid Waste Inspector.** We welcome John Creager who will work part-time addressing the daily deluge of complaints and issues regarding solid waste collection.

Media Release: On July 24th, 2022 at about 9:56 AM, officers responded to the area of the 100 block of West Bethel Street for a report of a weapons discharge. On arrival, officers located a shell casing from a handgun that had been fired into the pavement. There were no injuries resulting from the shooting. Further investigation utilizing City surveillance cameras revealed the shooting was a result of a dispute between Nathaniel Hynson, age 39, and Karem Roberts, age 31, both of Hagerstown. The dispute resulted in Hynson leaping onto the hood of Roberts' vehicle as it traveled the wrong direction on West Bethel Street. Roberts discharged a handgun from the driver's seat toward Hynson and continued to drive with Hynson holding onto the hood of the vehicle. A female passenger holding an infant-aged child was also in the vehicle at the time of the shooting. Child Protective Services was notified regarding the child. Officers

located Hynson nearby and placed him under arrest. Hynson sustained a minor laceration to his finger as a result of holding onto the vehicle. While in custody, Hynson bit an officer and caused a laceration to the officer's hand. Officers later located Roberts and the vehicle he was driving during the dispute. Roberts was placed under arrest and officers obtained a search warrant for the vehicle, recovering a handgun. The handgun matched evidence located on scene. Hynson was charged in relation to this case with the following: Affray; Disorderly Conduct; Resisting Arrest; Hindering; Multiple pedestrian traffic violations; Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer. Roberts is prohibited from possessing a firearm in Maryland based on previous convictions for convictions in New York for torturing and injuring animals and assault convictions in Maryland for assault, drug distribution and carrying a dangerous weapon with intent to cause injury. Roberts has been charged in relation to this case with the following: Assault 1st degree; Assault 2nd degree; Reckless Endangerment; Numerous firearm related charges; Multiple traffic violations; Resisting arrest; Disorderly conduct.

Man's Best Friend: On July 23rd at approximately 3:30 p.m., officers responded to the 200 block of West Irvin Avenue for a report that a female stopped her vehicle, removed a kennel with a dog in it, left it on the sidewalk, and then drove away. When officers arrived, they could see the dog was in distress due to the heat. There was no water in the crate and it had no liner or bottom so the dog's paws were touching the hot pavement. Officers immediately removed the dog from the kennel and placed him in a cruiser with air conditioning. The Washington County Humane Society was contacted and they took custody of the animal. Through investigation and the help of a neighborhood door camera, the suspect was identified. The charges have not yet been officially approved by the Court Commissioner, so the suspect's identity is not being released at this time. The quick action of the neighbors and responding officers saved this dog from serious injury and quite possibly saved his life. Thanks to the Washington County Humane Society for taking custody and care of the dog. The Washington County Humane Society will also be doing their own investigation and filing any further appropriate charges.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS
