## DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

**Economic Development.** Staff attended the third Washington County Social Collective Business Mixer at the Grand Piano Ballroom on September 7th. Over 30 small business owners and representatives turned out and spoke regarding their businesses. Staff highlighted DCED services, Downtown Events, and invited many for continued meetings for potential expansion of their operations.

**Community Development.** The Hagerstown Youth Advisory Council has chosen the appointees for the Partner Group. They will be appointed on September 27<sup>th</sup>. HYAC Student Member applications close on September 12<sup>th</sup>.

## ENGINEERING

1. **Rain Event on 9/7.** The storm on September 7<sup>th</sup> dropped 2" in 45 minutes (close to 4" in the west end) and caused widespread flooding and damage to property. Staff met with many property owners and investigated numerous complaints. Some issues will need to be reviewed further.
2. **Windswept.** In partnership with John Barr, the sculpture was installed on the Cultural Trail at Lee Street this week making it the 27<sup>th</sup> piece of public art in the City!

**Testing Date:** The next comprehensive test date is scheduled for Saturday, September 10th. A written exam, physical test and initial interview will be administered at the new Washington County Public Safety Training Center, located at 18350 Public Safety Place, Hagerstown. If selected and successfully complete the background process, candidates will be hired at full salary and benefits while awaiting the next academy that begins in January, 2023. HPD is continually looking for good men and women to help protect and serve the citizens of Hagerstown.

**Gas Leak:** A 6-inch gas line was struck by workers in the area of South Potomac Street and West Memorial Boulevard on Tuesday afternoon. HPD assisted with the evacuation of over 400 children at Bester Elementary School and assisted HFD until the incident was clear.

**All Hands on Deck:** The City experienced approximately 2 inches of rain in short period of time on Wednesday. In addition to multiple locations throughout the City with flooding conditions, HPD also experienced a flash flood in the basement. Department staff from various divisions rolled up their sleeves (and pants) to minimize the damage to the building and protect the evidence areas.

**Animal Cruelty:** Officers responded to 1700 Wesel Boulevard (Sam's Club) when a citizen observed a dog locked inside a vehicle. Another citizen had been able to unlock the doors by accessing the sun roof because the dog appeared to be in distress. The vehicle was not running and the interior temperature was estimated at approximately 100 degrees. Officer Kelley removed the dog and placed him in the K-9 cruiser. After review of the store's video footage, it was determined that the dog was left in the hot vehicle for over an hour. Upon her return to her car with a cart full of groceries, Mervet Rinehart was charged a citation for leaving her dog unattended. The Washington County Humane Society took possession of the dog and will also be placing appropriate charges.




