1. **Hager House.** Work is complete on the restoration of the house including all window repairs, door repairs, shutter repairs, porch deck replacement and plaster work inside. Painting of the exterior trim of the Visitor's Center remains to be completed.
2. **Professional Court.** Staff met with Washington County Engineering to review plans for inspection, funding compliance and administration. Work may begin in November.
3. **City Park Bandshell.** Work continues on the bandshell restoration. The contractor is focusing right now on flashing replacements and painting of wood trim.
4. **Traffic Signal Pole Inspections.** We approved a small contract to inspect 16 traffic signal poles, most are 60+ years old and have never been inspected for fatigue or cracking.

Media Release: On October 6th, 2022 at approximately 3:18 pm the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the intersection of Dual Highway and Edgewood Drive for a serious motor vehicle crash. Upon arrival, officers learned that a motorcycle and a Honda sedan collided in the middle of the intersection. Medical aid was immediately provided to the driver of the motorcycle, however he unfortunately died at the scene. The deceased was identified as 23 year old Luke Garrett Flook of Williamsport Maryland. The driver of the Honda sedan was not injured in the crash. A crash reconstructionist responded to the scene of the crash and began an investigation. Anyone who may have witnessed the crash is asked to contact Ofc. The Hagerstown Police Department offers its condolences to the Flook family.

Congratulations. Officer Jacob Mull, a June graduate from the Police Academy, successfully completed Field Training and is now certified for solo patrol. Officer Mull has been assigned to Charlie Platoon. We wish him much success in his career.

Officer of the Month – Officer Main: On September 30, 2022 at approximately 11:47 a.m., Ofc. Main was responding to 120 Church Street for a trespassing complaint. When Ofc. Main came in to the area, he observed a male at the corner of North Prospect Street and Church Street backing away from another male. Ofc. Main took note that the 1st male appeared to be so afraid for his safety he walked backwards into a road sign. Ofc. Main also observed the suspect kept his left hand up but had his right hand pinned to his waist area, which Ofc. Main recognized as consistent with individuals concealing a handgun. Due to the belief that the suspect was armed with a handgun and he was going to potentially assault the male, Ofc. Main exited his vehicle and ordered the suspect to show Ofc. Main his hands.

The suspect immediately ran north on North Prospect Street before turning east on Williams Avenue. The suspect fell while running but quickly got to his feet and continued running. Ofc. Main could clearly see what appeared to be a handgun in the suspect's right hand and ordered him to stop and show his hands. The suspect ignored the order and Ofc. Main continued pursuit on foot. As he ran north on Jonathan Street, the suspect tripped again and fell on his stomach. As Ofc. Main was placing him into custody he threw a brown handled handgun into the street. Ofc. Main and additional officers placed the suspect into custody. Ofc. Main later recovered a loaded Rhm Gesellschaft RG22 revolver with an obliterated serial number from the street where the suspect had thrown it. The revolver was later unloaded and found to contain 5 SuperX .22 long rifle rounds and 1 Remington .22 Long rifle round.

The suspect was transported to Central Booking where he was charged with numerous firearm related charges including being prohibited from possessing a regulated firearm. We are thankful that this situation ended without any serious injury. A job well done by Ofc. Main with his keen observation skills; it is likely that he prevented a shooting incident. For his efforts, Ofc. Main has been selected as Officer of the Month for September 2022.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
