Promotion: Congratulations to Officer Alec Routhier on his recent promotion to Sergeant. He was sworn in by Mayor Emily Keller in the Council Chamber at City Hall. Sergeant Routhier has served the City of Hagerstown for nearly nine years as a patrol officer, Community Resource Officer, honor guard member and is an active member of our Special Response Team. He will be assigned to Baker Platoon. We wish him much success in his new position.

Ending Needless Violence with our Youth (ENVY): HPD's MCIN Coordinator is continuing to coordinate meetings with ENVY. The focus of the coalition includes engagement with middle school age youth for prevention and intervention with regards to violence; conducting a survey of youth in the community to get their take on things and elicit ideas from them; and creating a resource guide that would identify each of the ENVY partners and what services they offer.

Youth Engagement: HPD's MCIN Coordinator will be visiting Elgin Station (Elgin Boulevard) as well as the Boys and Girls Club (Pennsylvania Avenue) once a month to engage more directly with the youth at those locations. The visits will sometimes include officers or detectives in an effort to start forging more positive relationships with the youth in our community.

Neighborhoods 1st: HPD's Community Liaison has been coordinating holiday events and supplies with the N1st groups. Glow sticks were provided to participating N1st groups for trick or treat safety on Halloween. Staff is assisting with luminary supplies for N1st groups planning Night of Lights events in their neighborhoods.

Community Conversation: The City & HPD are working to continue the community conversation with the historic Jonathan Street neighborhood. A meeting will be held on Thursday, November 17 at 7 pm at Parkside Community Center to continue the community conversation started last month.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





The City of Hagerstown has contracted with Waste Management, Inc. for Hagerstown's ECYCLES DAY! This one-day recycling event offers city residents a **FREE and convenient opportunity** to dispose of unwanted residential electronic devices and to securely shred personal documents.

All documents will be transported directly from the event to the paper shredding facility in a secured truck. The documents will then be shredded, baled, and sent to a paper recycling facility where the ink is removed, the paper is turned into a pulp, and ultimately used to create new paper or fiber products.

NEW ▶ Secure paper shredding. **ALL DOCUMENTS** will be **PROPERLY DESTROYED** and then recycled!



ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: Computers—CPUs, monitors, peripherals, printers, keyboards, photocopiers, fax machines, VCRs, televisions, stereos, cell phones, home & office phones, and consumer electronics.
