### MEDIA RELEASES:

**Maryland Avenue Incident** (May 24, 2023): On Wednesday 5/24/23 at approximately 3:50pm, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the area of W. First St and Maryland Ave for a report of multiple shots fired. Officers recovered numerous shell casings in the area and learned that 2 structures in the 900 block of Maryland Ave were hit along with 5 different vehicles. There were no reported injuries.

In connection with the investigation, a search and seizure warrant was executed at a residence in the 900 block of Maryland Ave. Dejaniro Armante Rivera, age 25, was arrested. He was a resident of the home where the warrant was served. Rivera is charged with: 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> degree attempted murder; 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> degree assault; Reckless endangerment; Numerous firearms related charges

HPD would like to thank the neighborhood community who were immensely helpful providing information that led to this arrest. Anyone with further information is asked to contact Ofc. We are particularly interested in any private/residential security footage that has not already been disclosed to us. This is an active and ongoing investigation. More details will be released as appropriate.

**S. Potomac Street Incident** (May 26, 2023) - On Friday, 5/26/23 at about 1:20am Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to a residence in the 400 block of S. Potomac St. for a report of a shooting. A female victim, later identified as Carol Thompson, age 55 of Hagerstown, was located with a gunshot wound to the stomach and her right hand. Officers immediately began to render aid until Community Rescue Service arrived on scene and took over medical care. She was transported to Meritus Medical Center for treatment. The victim is expected to make a full recovery.

As one of the officers was arriving on the scene, he saw a male in between houses in the 400 block of S. Potomac St. He made contact with the male, later identified as Russell Younker (age 37 of Hagerstown), and as the officer was approaching him he noticed a small handgun lying next to Younker’s feet. Younker was subsequently arrested. In the immediate area of Younker at the time of his arrest were 3 additional firearms along with small containers of suspected narcotics. A search and seizure warrant was executed at the residence where the shooting took place. Additional narcotics were located along with ammunition and an additional loaded gun magazine. At this time the shooting incident is still being investigated. Younker has been charged with numerous firearms and narcotics related violations.

**Hager House Incident (May 26, 2023)** – On 5/26/23 at about 5:50am, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the Hagerstown City Park at the Jonathan Hager House for a report of a deceased person. A 37 year old female from Hagerstown was located inside a stone alcove beneath the porch of the house. She was pronounced deceased at the scene and the incident is being investigated as an apparent homicide. The victim had been known to sleep at this location and we believe it likely that the suspect and victim were known to one another.

We will not be releasing the name of the victim pending notification of proper next of kin. In addition, in order to protect the integrity of the investigation we will not be releasing any further details including the manner of death. This is an active and ongoing investigation. **CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY**





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
