CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY: The first class of the newly revamped Citizens Police Academy celebrated their completion during a graduation brunch held in Downtown Hagerstown at Schindel Rohrer last Saturday. Twelve community members are now officially department ambassadors by completing this seven week inside look at City Policing.



OFFICER OF THE MONTH: Officer Ryan Howard has been selected as Officer of the Month for May. While responding to a report of a shooting, Baker shift officers found a female with a gunshot wound to her hand and abdomen. As Officer Howard was approaching the address on foot, he observed a male three doors down from the address in between two houses digging in a flower pot. Officer Howard approached the individual and observed a gun. Officer Howard handcuffed the subject. In the end the male had four guns (one of which was reported stolen) on him, CDS for distribution and brass knuckles. It is suspected that he had just shot the woman in his residence. In addition, the male was a suspect in an incident with a gun from the previous day. Officer Howard displayed exceptional situational awareness scanning his surroundings as he approached the house. The male was attempting to bury the handguns in the flower pot. Officer Howard just graduated from the police academy this past winter and he is to be commended for his quick actions and safely detaining the suspect.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
