**Economic Development**

Spring Sprouts Grant Finalized – Nearly \$20,000 in grant funds were pushed out to a total of 28 businesses in Downtown. Spring Sprouts Grant is a microgrant program offered during Spring time each year. Businesses can leverage the grant to purchase equipment, marketing, training/professional development, and storefront beautification that they may otherwise not have purchased due to budget constraints.

### Community Development

Staff has selected and arranged delivery of major appliances to furnish 261-263 S. Prospect Street in preparation of actively marketing these properties for sale through the Hagerstown Homeownership Program. Income-qualified homebuyers will be eligible to purchase the properties as a primary residence, providing stabilization for low-to-moderate income City residents and bringing these properties back onto the tax rolls.

## ENGINEERING

1. **Hub City Parking Garage** – staff held a pre-construction meeting with the contractor and the Washington County Conservation District. The Notice to Proceed has been issued for Monday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, and the contractor will be moving equipment into the site next week.
2. **Trash & Recycling Collection** – staff met with the Homeowners Association of the Summerland Manor development to discuss the upcoming changes to trash collection with the issuance of trash carts to all residents in the City.
3. **West Irvin Avenue Sidewalks** – the contractor mobilized and began work on installing sidewalks along the north side of the street between Woodland Way and Belview Avenue.
4. **Pavement Preservation Program** – Craig Paving is milling the pavement on East Wilson Boulevard between Frederick Street and Potomac Street, and plans to pave the street next week.
5. **SRTS Hagerstown Misc** – Contractor has completed all punchlist items and we are waiting on ADA inspection from SHA.

**Media Release:** On June 13, 2023, the Washington County Narcotics Task Force executed a Search and Seizure Warrant at an address on West Wilson Blvd in Hagerstown, Maryland. Agents arrested Corey James Douglas, a 45-year-old male, on three outstanding warrants. Douglas was also found to be in possession of over 100 Grams of suspected Fentanyl, over 30 grams of suspected crack cocaine, and one handgun that he was prohibited from possessing. Douglas was taken to the Washington County Detention Center, where he is being held on the above charges. The Washington County Narcotics Task Force was assisted in the investigation by the Hagerstown Police Department Criminal Investigation Unit.

**CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY**





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





