DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Community Development members met with a representative from Frederick’s Department of Housing & Human Services to share strategies about the CDBG grant program.

Sub recipient agreements and award notices for Public Service grants were distributed to local non-profits!

DCED Team Members attended the ribbon cutting event for the Community Health Hub located at the Horizon Goodwill Industries building at 200 N. Prospect Street. Representatives from the Maryland Community Health Resources Commission presented a grant for \$925,000 through the Pathways to Health Equity program. The Community Health Hub is a partnership program of Horizon Goodwill Industries, Meritus Medical Center, Brook Lane, AHEC West and the Maryland Health Connection.

ENGINEERING

1. **Hub City Garage** – contractor began excavation of existing pavement and subsoils at the northern end of the site. Five feet of existing unsuitable soil will be removed from the entire building footprint, and will be replaced with structural backfill.
2. **Paul Smith Boulevard** – contractor has completed storm drain and utility installation, and has nearly completed earthwork to bring the roadway up to grade. Preparations are being made to cement-stabilize the road subgrade in advance of placement of the new pavement section.
3. **West Irvin Avenue Sidewalks** – contractor has completed the reconstruction of the alley entrance, and will be installing the new sidewalks and handicap ramps next week.

Significant Incidents:

6/26/23 – HFD responded to Interstate 81 in the area of Halfway Blvd for a tanker truck overturned. After investigation, it was determined the truck was carrying Ammonium Nitrate. The incident was upgraded to a hazmat response, bringing addition units from the county. There was a small leak that was mitigated on the scene. The Maryland Department of the Environment arrived and crews worked closely with them for further mitigation. The interstate was closed for the duration of the incident.

6/27/23 – HFD units responded to Kensington Drive for a gas leak. Crews found high gas readings in an apartment. The building was evacuated while HFD secured the leak and ventilated the structure.

In the month of June, HPD handled 5500 calls for service. Officers responded to approximately 180 calls per day, 428 reports were filed and 162 arrests were made. To date, HPD has recovered nearly \$24,000 in drug money. Money is subject to asset forfeiture proceedings through the court system.

Our officers continue to make an impact in the community. Below is a sample of some of the work that has been happening.

- CDS not cannabis, 200 blk Jonathan St – Rondall Jones charged with crack possession incident to arrest for burglary warrants
- Handgun, CDS not cannabis, 400 blk Mitchell Ave- Denroy Defreitas arrested on traffic stop for handgun possession and drug trafficking violations
- Thomas Gordon arrested for residential burglary in progress. Gordon charged for five additional previous burglaries
- Handgun, Frederick and E First St- William Gunn III observed in vehicle with a handgun in his lap.
- Warrant, Assault on Officer, CDS- Frederick at E First St- Jermain Gordon arrested after foot pursuit for outstanding handgun warrants. Gordon also charged with assault on officer, attempting to disarm officer, cds not cannabis and resisting arrest
- Warrant, Frederick, MD – Davonta Thomas arrested with USMS (United States Marshal Service) for attempted murder/shots fired in Noland Dr. incident. Christina Rickett arrested on Noland Dr with USMS for conspiracy charges related to shots fired.

- Warrant, 100 block Elm St – Benji Russell wanted by USMS Fugitive Apprehension Team for rape and sex assault warrants.
- Warrant, 200 blk Jonathan St – Rondall Jones arrested for burglary warrants after foot chase
- Warrant (SRT Search Warrant Execution), 100 block Randolph Ave- Efrem Jones arrested for warrant from shooting incident that occurred at Jonathan St and West North Ave. Evidence recovered during search warrant related to the shooting
- Warrant, Cannon / Washington- Milton Brown arrested for 1st degree burglary warrant

Media Release: On June 28th 2023, at about 11:00 am, officers responded to the 200 block of Columbia Avenue for a report of a burglary in progress. Officers were told that a neighbor had heard a loud crash and then saw someone enter the residence. When they arrived on scene, officers saw the rear window to the residence was broken out and someone walking inside. Units established a perimeter around the residence and attempted to call the suspect out.

When the suspect did not come out, officers entered the residence and located a male later identified as Thomas Lee Gordon (age 43 of Hagerstown) inside. Gordon was not a resident of the home and did not have permission to be there. He was taken into custody and as a result of his arrest, officers were able to close 4 other burglaries cases that had occurred in the last 30 days. The other burglaries were in the 300 block of Wakefield Rd, the 1300 block of Woodland Way, the 1100 block of The Terrace, and the 900 block of Kenwood Dr. Gordon was charged in all five burglary cases and was transported to the Washington County Detention Center where he is currently being held without bond.

Fireworks at Fairgrounds Park: Forty-one officers worked this event. There only three incidents including a minor fight between two juveniles and two minor accidents in the parking lot. Officers enjoyed a game of soccer with some children anxiously awaiting the fireworks. Chief Kifer donated hamburgers and hotdogs to provide to personnel working the event. He and Captain Langston manned the grills.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

HUB CITY GARAGE

Excavation has begun on the new Hub City Parking Garage. Approximately 5 feet of soil has to be removed and then new soil brought in for a sound foundation. Work should progress quickly on this part of the project. Precast concrete should start to rise out of the ground sometime in September.

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Monday, June 26, 2023 @ 4:04 PM: Parks staff reported vandalism at the bathroom at Fairgrounds Park. Staff cleaned up site and replaced damaged soap dispensers. Two hours later staff found bathroom vandalized for a second time. Bathrooms were cleaned and soap dispensers were replaced the next day.

Saturday, July 1, 2023 @ 8:56 AM: Park attendant notified staff of vandalism to the electrical service at Hager Park. Attendant verified electric still worked and was safe for use for renters on Saturday and Sunday. A work order was placed with the City's electrical contractor for repairs.

Saturday, July 1, 2023 @ 10:20 AM: Dispatch reported crates of milk in the roadway on Dual Highway at Lidl. Staff investigated and found a number of milk jugs that had already been put on the sidewalk by HPD. This is State Highway jurisdiction but since jugs were still there on Monday morning, Street Dept. employees removed them.

Sunday, July 2, 2023 @ 2:27 PM: Staff received report of graffiti on the inline rink at Fairgrounds Park. The graffiti was removed the same day.

Saturday, July 1, 2023 @ 4:02 PM: Staff received a report of people in the bathroom at Fairgrounds Park and messing them up. A park attendant followed up and found two boys in the bathrooms with their bikes. After the boys left marijuana was found.

Saturday, July 1, 2023 @ 11:30 PM: Staff was notified by HFD of a fire in a trash can at the south pavilion at City Park and that HFD was on site. The next morning staff checked the park and south pavilion. The trash can that had the fire was in fact located at the Key St. pavilion.

Sunday, July 2, 2023 @ 8:43 PM: Dispatch reported a call for debris in street from homeless camp at Eastern Blvd. and Mt. Aetna. Staff visited site but could not locate any debris in street in the area.


