

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Economic Development activities included:

Staff participated in a roundtable discussion and business visit with Maryland Commerce Secretary Kevin Anderson.

Staff participated in a Field House site visit and meeting with Comptroller Brooke Lierman.

Staff presented to Habitat for Humanity’s Capital Campaign Committee regarding potential site location options and related Q&A. The organization is reviewing potential existing properties and new build options for a planned \$6 million Capital Campaign for their new headquarters.

ENGINEERING

1. **Clara Barton Memorial** – the contractor has mobilized, and is preparing to pour the concrete base that will support the future statue. Delivery of the granite base for the sculpture is tentatively scheduled for August 21st.
2. **Paul Smith Boulevard** – the subcontractor mobilized to the site, and completed the main portion of the cement stabilization of the roadway subgrade. After allowing the cement to set and gain strength, the contractor will begin placement of the roadway’s pavement section. The developer of the Currwood warehouse indicated that they are still on schedule to complete their project by the end of October.
3. **Comptroller Visit** – staff met with Maryland Comptroller Lierman at the former Municipal Stadium site to discuss the upcoming Field House project, and the projected positive impact that it will have on the City.
4. **Pavement Preservation** – Craig Paving is milling and paving portions of North Burhans Boulevard and Eastern Boulevard, and both should be completed early next week. This will essentially wrap-up the FY23 Pavement Preservation contract.

Thirteen taken into Custody During S. Cannon Ave./E. Antietam St. Proactive Enforcement Detail
 On Friday, July 28, 2023 between the hours of 0900 – 1200 hours, officers of the Hagerstown Police Department conducted a “High Visibility/Pro-Active Enforcement” detail in the area of S Cannon Ave and E Antietam St. During this assignment, officers located 5 individuals with warrants and took them into custody without issue. 8 more individuals were charged with various quality of life crimes to include trespassing and pedestrian traffic citations.

7/30/2023: On Sunday, July 30, 2023 at 3:08pm, officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to 1028 Brinker Drive in reference to a double shooting. Investigations determined one male victim age 24 died from a gunshot wound and another victim, a 31-year-old female was struck multiple times. She was transported to Meritus Medical Center with serious injuries. The victims are believed to be familiar with the suspect and this is an isolated incident. Victim information will be released after notification of family. This is an active investigation. CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
