

2-Alarm Apartment Building Fire with Rescue

HFD responded to a call for an apartment fire at 10:48am on Friday, August 4, 2023. Engine 1 arrived promptly after dispatch to find smoke coming from the second and third floors of a three-story apartment building at 110/112 E. Washington Street. Reports alerted them of occupants trapped inside which prompted a second alarm.

Upon entering the building, crews discovered a fire in an apartment on the second floor. The firefighter from Engine 1 located a 17-year-old female in the apartment and was able to quickly get her to a window and pass her to a firefighter on a ladder to be removed from the building.

She was originally transported to Meritus Medical Center, but later transferred to Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center in Baltimore. She is currently in the Intensive Care Unit and undergoing treatment for her injuries.

Bystanders remained adamant that there were others trapped in the building, and with assistance from the Hagerstown Police Department and the Washington County Sheriff's Office, all individuals were accounted for with a total of 19 displaced. They are being aided by the American Red Cross. Several pets were rescued by fire personnel and are in the care of the Humane Society of Washington County.

While fire was contained to the second floor of the six-unit building, there was smoke damage throughout, and the City's Planning & Code Administration found no choice but to condemn it.

The cause of the fire remains under investigation by the City of Hagerstown Fire Marshal's Office.

No working smoke detectors were present in the apartment. People inside indicated they were only alerted to the fire by the smell of smoke.

HFD reminds every one of the vital importance of having working smoke alarms on every level of homes and in apartments. They maximize the time individuals need to get out of a burning building quickly and safely.

Hazardous Materials Automatic Aide Assist

HFD responded with Engine 4, Truck 4, and Battalion Chief 301 to assist Washington County DES and Williamsport VFC with a Hazardous Materials Incident on Snug Harbor Lane on Saturday, August 5, 2023 just after 7:00pm. Personnel encountered a chlorine emergency in a basement containing a pool filtration system. HFD staff participated in entry and hazard mitigation as part of the hazardous materials team. As always, crews worked collectively and collaboratively for a successful and safe incident outcome.

Emergency Response Drill with Columbia Gas

HFD participated with Columbia Gas in an emergency response drill on Wednesday, August 9, 2023. This drill consisted of multiple components that evaluated the response of not only Columbia Gas, but emergency services to include police, fire and hazardous materials. Multiple HFD units attended the drill, which was not only a wonderful training exercise, but an opportunity to network with Columbia Gas representatives, to ensure operational readiness when a real emergency occurs.

Media Releases:

8/7/2023: On August 5, 2023 at 3:57am, officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to 54 Devonshire Road in reference to a victim that was assaulted with a hammer and later determined to have sustained a gunshot wound. The victim was flown to Shock Trauma in Baltimore and is in critical condition. The suspect, Timothy Lee Ware, took an infant from the home. He and the victim are the parents of the child.

The child was located in Smithsburg a few hours later with the assistance of the Washington County Sheriff's Dept. CPS was notified and responded for the child. The victim remains in critical condition and the suspect is still at large and has been charged with the following: Attempted 1st and 2nd Degree Murder; 1st and 2nd Degree Assault; Reckless Endangerment; Neglect of a minor; Various gun charges.

8/8/2023: Update: Timothy Ware was found deceased in Berkley County, WV of a suspected drug overdose.

Officer of the Month: Officer Cory Biden has been selected as Officer of the Month for July. Ofc. Biden responded to a call for a subject suffering from a mental health crisis. Ofc. Biden volunteered to go because he had a good relationship with the male from previous encounters.

On 07/10/23 Ofc. Biden responded to a call for a suicidal subject threatening to jump into traffic. Ofc. Biden knew the subject suffering from the mental health crisis and had a very good rapport with the male. On this date as Ofc. Biden located the male standing in a lane of travel on the highway. At this time Ofc. Biden pushed the male back and tried to talk to him, calling the male by his name. The male responded to Ofc. Biden and then sprinted for the roadway where traffic was still traveling. Ofc. Biden was able to gain physical control of the male and remove him from the roadway, detain him and get him to Meritus Medical Center for help.

Ofc. Biden and this male have had previous interactions where the male has been suffering from a mental health crisis. While their encounters have never escalated to this degree, it is clear that Ofc. Biden treats each encounter with the same level of professionalism. On this date the male followed through with his threat of self-harm and had it not been for Ofc. Biden he may have been successful. A few days later the male came to the Hagerstown Police Department to thank Ofc. Biden. He was also concerned that Ofc. Biden had been injured during the incident and was relieved to find out he had not. Ofc. Biden's professionalism, quick action and respect for subjects suffering from mental health crises are a true standard for what the Hagerstown Police Department represents.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
