### Community Development:

Penny Mart celebrates the Grand Opening & Ribbon Cutting of their fifth Hagerstown location at 802 Salem Ave. Owner, Jamil Malik, says this is their biggest Penny Mart location yet, with 22 parking spaces and open 24 hours-a-day, 7 days-a-week.

## ENGINEERING

1. **Morningside Heights Storm Drainage Improvements** – contractor is substantially complete with all work, and is doing landscape installation and final restoration to the residents’ yards.
2. **Paul Smith Boulevard** – contractor has completed curb installation, and is installing the base pavement layer on the street.
3. **Hub City Garage** – staff attended a pre-construction meeting with the contractor that will be installing the rammed aggregate piers that will support the footers for the structure. That work will take two to three weeks to complete, and will be followed by concrete crews that will begin installing the footers.
4. **Greens at Hamilton Run Stream Restoration** – staff held a pre-construction meeting at the golf course to review the project with prospective bidders. Bids will be opened in October.

## Media Release:

Arrest made in the Homicide of Woman at City Park

UPDATE: (9/7/23) On September 5, 2023 Hagerstown Police Department's Criminal Investigation Unit sought a grand jury indictment of Anthony Lee Donnelly, age 41 of Hagerstown (no fixed address) for the murder of his wife, Rachela Virginia Disandro. The grand jury indicted Donnelly and he was apprehended today in Hagerstown without incident. Donnelly was subsequently transported to the Washington County Detention Center.

The indictment alleges that Donnelly stabbed Disandro to death. He is charged with: 1st/2nd Degree Murder; 1st/2nd Degree Assault; Reckless Endangerment; Dangerous Weapon: Intent to Injure

Thank you to our initial crime scene investigators and criminal investigators that worked hard to make sure this arrest happened. We also appreciate the diligence of the Washington County State's Attorney's Office and the sitting grand jury.

Original Release: On 5/26/23 at about 5:50am, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the Hagerstown City Park at the Jonathan Hager House for a report of a deceased person. A 37-year-old female from Hagerstown was located inside a stone alcove beneath the porch of the house. She was pronounced deceased at the scene and the incident is being investigated as an apparent homicide. The victim had been known to sleep at this location and we believe it likely that the suspect and victim were known to one another.

**CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY**





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY


