Community Development:

- Staff has published the draft FY23 Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Report (CAPER) for public comment. Comments will be received for the period 9/12/23 – 9/27/23, and the final report will be submitted to HUD on 9/28/23.
- On September 26th, the newest members of the Hagerstown Youth Council were sworn in for the 23-24 session. The Mayor & City Council also voted to approve an ordinance to increase the member limits of the Hagerstown Youth Council from 5 to 11 to 5 to 19. This change allows for increased participation in the youth council. The council's 4th Partner Group member, Tressa Nicewarner, was sworn in to serve her second term. We are ecstatic for our first meeting and cannot wait to serve!
- Staff submitted the FY23/FFY22 Consolidated Annual Performance Evaluation Report for CDBG to HUD on September 28, 2023. The CAPER is a review of activities and accomplishments for the CDBG program for the preceding fiscal year and is required to be filed every year 90 days after the end of the fiscal year.

ENGINEERING

1. **Hub City Garage** – the contractor is continuing with the rammed aggregate pier installation, and expects to reach completion by October 6th. Concrete foundation installation will follow immediately after that date.
2. **Hagerstown Field House** – the final addendum has been issued for the project, and the bid opening is set for 1:00 PM on October 3rd.
3. **MKS Business Park** – the contractor has been clearing trees and excavating an embankment as part of this stormwater management retrofit project.
4. **Professional Court** – the contractor is continuing to work on widening on the north side of the street. Based upon their progress, substantial completion of the project is still likely before the end of the calendar year.

Search & Seizure: On September 27, 2023, the Washington County Narcotics Task Force (WCNTF) executed a search and seizure warrant in the 200 block of Summer Street, Hagerstown MD. Agents recovered over 300 grams of suspected cocaine, approximately 77 grams of suspected fentanyl, a small amount of suspected methamphetamine, approximately nine pounds of suspected marijuana and two handguns. One of the handguns was a personally manufactured handgun, commonly referred to as a "ghost" gun with no serial number. The following person(s) were arrested and charged based on the execution of the warrant: Jeffrey Lynn Resseger, 43-year-old male; Krista Janele Adams, 36-year-old female. WCNTF was assisted by the Hagerstown Police Crime Suppression Unit and the Maryland State Police. This is an example of excellent collaboration by our local law enforcement!

Steering Wheel Lock Giveaway: On Saturday October 7th from 11:00am to 4:00pm, HPD will be giving steering wheel locks away to residents who own a Hyundai or Kia. The giveaway is in response to the ongoing social media "trend" where these vehicles are targeted for theft. Proof of residency and vehicle registration is required. Officers will be located in the main parking lot of Fairgrounds Park at 351 N. Cleveland Ave. Wheel locks were obtained through a collaboration with the MD Vehicle Theft Prevention Council, a division of the Maryland State Police.

Citizens Police Academy: Congratulations to the eight individuals who successfully graduated from the Citizens Police Academy this month. During this 7-week program, participants learned about the various roles and responsibilities of our officers, including investigations, traffic enforcement, community outreach, and many other topics. They also gained hands-on experience with police equipment and tactics. We thank these citizens for their willingness and commitment to learning about law enforcement and for their dedication to become ambassadors for what it is we do to keep our city safe.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
