ENGINEERING

1. **Hagerstown Field House** – nine (9) bids for this project were opened on October 3rd. The City and the design team are evaluating the bids and checking references, and will make a recommendaiton to the City Council on October 17th.
2. **Greens at Hamilton Run** – bids were opened for the proposed stream restoration project at the golf course. A total of thirteen contractors submitted bids, and staff is reviewing the proposals.
3. **Hub City Garage** – installation of the rammed aggregate piers that will support the parking deck’s foundations is substantially complete, and work has already begun on the concrete footer installation.
4. **Washington County Museum of Fine Arts** – staff met with representatives of the museum to discuss their plans for future improvements to the building, and re-use of the former Bock Oil property.

Officer of the Month: Officer Travis Wheat has been selected as officer of the month, September 2023. Officer Wheat saw a suspicious subject in a high crime area who he knew to be an affiliated gang member. He knew this male and his family members to be involved in multiple shootings this year. Officer Wheat previously took a report for this male, who made a video and posted it to Instagram of himself holding a firearm stating, “I’m going to kill cops”.

Officer Wheat observed this male trespass on property that the Police Department had been requested to enforce. He conducted a frisk for weapons based on his knowledge of the male and belief that he was armed. Officer Wheat immediately recognized that the male had an AR-15 style rifle tucked in his pants. Officer Wheat safely placed the male on the ground and he was taken into custody

without incident. The firearm was recovered safely without injury to anyone in this very dangerous situation. There is no doubt that Officer Wheat's actions in this incident prevented a potential shooting and injury to another person. Congratulations to Ofc. Wheat on his nomination and selection as officer of the month.

Reminder - Steering Wheel Lock Giveaway: On Saturday October 7th from 11:00am to 4:00pm, HPD will be giving steering wheel locks away to residents who own a Hyundai or Kia. The giveaway is in response to the ongoing social media "trend" where these vehicles are targeted for theft. Proof of residency and vehicle registration is required. Officers will be located in the main parking lot of Fairgrounds Park at 351 N. Cleveland Ave. Wheel locks were obtained through a collaboration with the MD Vehicle Theft Prevention Council, a division of the Maryland State Police.
