ENGINEERING

1. **Hagerstown Field House** – staff and the Eastern Sports Management design team evaluated the bids submitted for the project, and short-listed two contractors for in-person interviews. Staff will make a recommendation to the Council at the October 17th work session meeting.
2. **Hub City Garage** – the contractor is installing concrete footers and foundations in preparation for the setting of precast concrete columns and panels. It is anticipated that a partial closure of Antietam Street will be implemented during the week of November 8th.

3. **Train Hub Locomotive Restoration** – staff advertised the contract for the restoration of Engine 202 at the City Park Train Hub. The scope of work includes cosmetic restoration of the locomotive, and the construction of a new pavilion to cover the locomotive.

Significant Incidents

10/6/23 – HFD units responded to the 100 block of E Howard St for a reported apartment fire. Arriving crews found a contained cooking fire and set up ventilation. There was no extension to the remainder of the house.

10/7/23 - Crews participated in the Hagerstown Regional Airport Tri-Annual FAA Mass Casualty Drill. Crews were assigned to assist with triage of patients on site.

10/10/23 – Units from HFD responded to Jade Ct off Robinwood Drive for a working townhouse fire. Engine 3 was the first arriving engine and found a large volume of fire from an end of the row townhouse unit. Crews quickly deployed handlines and eventually elevated master streams to knock down the fire. The majority of the fire was contained to the end unit.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOUR CALL BACKS

Thursday, October 5, 2023 @ 5:50 PM: Dispatch called and reported the signals at intersection Burhans Blvd. at Chuch / Salem Ave. completely out due to a pedestrian pole being struck. BMX Gold Cup at Fairgrounds Park

Hundreds of professional and amateur BMX riders of all ages will arrive at Fairgrounds Park this Friday for the USA BMX Gold Cup Championship Northeast on October 13-15, 2023. Nearly 2,500 registrants, families and spectators are expected to attend. There are no road closures for the event and all facilities at Fairgrounds Park will remain open to the public. However, all parking within the Fairgrounds will be paid parking. Those looking to use the skatepark, dog park, etc. are asked to utilize street parking and walk in. BMX Event Parking fees: \$10 per day per car; \$25 per car for the weekend.

City Parks
