DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Community Development

Community Development Staff presented at the Main Street Business Owner meeting to share about Choice Neighborhoods and launched the Choice Neighborhoods Business Owner survey.

ENGINEERING

1. **Meritus Park** – the City’s contractor worked to install a new crosswalk and the rapidly flashing beacons on West Baltimore Street in advance of the opening day for the Flying Boxcars. Work to relocate the Cultural Trail will continue after the opening weekend. Staff also installed sidewalk decals to direct patrons from the downtown parking decks and lots to the stadium.
2. **Greens at Hamilton Run** – the contractor is substantially complete with the stream restoration project, and is performing final clean-up. The goal is to reopen the course to play by mid-May.
3. **Hagerstown Field House** – the contractor has completed the erection of the steel frame for the turf field building, and will begin installing the roof on the structure next week. Erection continues on the hard court building, which has more structural elements needed to support basketball stanchions, scoreboards, and other equipment.

Significant Incidents

4/28/24 – *Porch Fire* – HFD units responded to the 800 Blk of Dewey Ave for a reported house fire. Crews arrived to find a smoldering fire on the porch. Fire was quickly extinguished with no extension to the house.

4/29/24 – *Kitchen Fire* – HFD units responded to the 1100 Blk of Outer Drive for a reported house fire. Units arrived to find smoke showing from a single-family residence. Crews made entry to find fire in the kitchen cabinetry and quickly extinguished the fire before it spread.

4/29/24 – *Outside Fire* – HFD units responded to the 200 Blk of N Locust St for an outside fire. The incident was upgraded to a structure fire assignment by the dispatch center prior to HFD arrival, as there was a fence on fire encroaching on a house. Engine 1 and Engine 2 arrived and quickly knocked the fire down before it reached the house. Remaining units were cancelled by Engine 1.

4/30/24 – *Cooking Fire Extinguished by Sprinkler* – HFD units responded to an automatic fire alarm at Cortland Apartments on Little Elliot Drive. Crews arrived to find light smoke coming from an apartment. Upon entry, crews found that the sprinkler system had successfully extinguished a fire on the stove.

Media Releases:

Homicide: On 4/28/24 at about 10:30 am, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department were asked to check on the welfare of an individual in the 400 block of McDowell Avenue. On arrival at the residence, officers discovered an apparent homicide victim, later determined to be 57-year-old Renee Elizabeth Shoemaker of Hagerstown. Criminal Investigators and Forensic Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene. The investigation revealed that this was a domestic related homicide and the victim and suspect resided together.

At approximately 5:30 pm, Officers of the Harrisburg (PA) City Police Department came in to contact with the homicide suspect and he was subsequently arrested. He is identified as Cleo Hermon Brown, age 50 of Hagerstown. Brown has been charged with 1st and 2nd degree homicide along with related charges.

HPD would like to thank Pennsylvania State Police Troop H and the Harrisburg Police Department for their assistance in the apprehension of Brown.

Fatal Motorcycle Accident: On 4/29/24 at about 12:20 pm, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the intersection of W. Wilson Boulevard and Virginia Avenue for a collision involving a motorcycle and a 4-door sedan. The rider of the motorcycle, later identified as Francis Walter age (age 35 of Hagerstown), was transported to Meritus Medical Center where he was pronounced deceased. The driver of the car remained on scene and was assessed by CRS for minor injuries. The rider of the motorcycle was traveling eastbound through the intersection and the driver of the car was making a left turn southbound on to Virginia Avenue from W. Wilson Boulevard. An accident reconstructionist was called to the scene and this is an ongoing investigation. The driver of the car is not being identified at this time, pending the outcome of the investigation.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
