CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

Thursday, May 23, 2024 @ 3:36 PM: Dispatch requested assistance with deer carcass removal at Eastern Blvd. at Fiery Funeral Home. Staff reported to site but could not locate dead animal.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
