## Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

World Treasures Thrift Shop, located at 524 Frederick Street, celebrated the Grand Opening of their new location on Friday, June 7. Owned & operated by the Mennonite Central Committee, they are on a mission to be “the most unique thrift shop in Hagerstown,” and donate proceeds from sales to charitable causes worldwide and locally.

## ENGINEERING

1. **Hagerstown Field House** – the contractor did a large concrete pour (nearly 600 cubic yards) for the slab in the hardcourt building; this slab needs to be extremely flat to accept the sports flooring that will be installed later. Work continues on the building’s central section, and the wall siding.
2. **Pavement Preservation** – beginning next week, the contractor will return to mill and overlay the remaining streets on the FY24 paving list. The FY25 paving contract is currently out to bid.
3. **Wheaton Park Phase II Improvements** – our consultant submitted conceptual plans for a natural play area at the park; another consultant is working the design of a new bandshell/stage that will be installed near the tennis courts.

**CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY**





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
