ENGINEERING

1. **Hub City Garage** – curbing has been installed at the entrances, and repairs have been made to the existing storm drainage system in Antietam Street. Installation of the parking equipment is nearing completion, and the contractor is working to bring the project to completion.
2. **Dual Highway Safety Improvements** – staff attended a workshop with MDOT and Smart Growth America to discuss temporary “quick build” demonstration projects to improve safety for vehicles, pedestrians, and bicyclists. The group is looking at a potential project site between Cannon Avenue and Cleveland Avenue. The City will host a second workshop with these groups in July.
3. **City Hall Elevator** – the contractor disassembled and removed the existing secondary elevator at City Hall, and received the new elevator equipment for installation.

Significant Incidents

6/14/24 – *Mutual Aid Confined Space Rescue* – Multiple HFD units were requested to assist with a confined space rescue in the Greencastle area. A person was trapped to their shoulders in a large grain bin. Crews worked off aerial apparatus to gain access to the victim and remove corn from around them until they were freed. HFD crews were specifically requested due to the number of confined space technicians on duty each day.



6/14/24 – *Overheated Motor* – HFD units responded to the Washington Garden Apts for a reported apartment fire. Units investigated to find an overheated vent fan in a bathroom. Crews ensured no fire extension into the structure and removed fan.

6/15/24 – *Small Fire in House* – HFD units responded to the 800 blk of S Potomac St for a reported house fire. Crews investigated to find a small, soldering fire in the floor from an electrical issue. Fire was extinguished and hazards secured.

6/15/24 – *Working Vehicle Fire* – HFD units responded to the 700 blk of Oak Hill Ave for a vehicle fire impinging on a structure. Units arrived to find a well-involved vehicle fire. Fire was quickly knocked with no extension to the adjacent structure.

6/18/24 – *Cooking Fire* – HFD units responded to the 800 blk of Maryland Ave for a reported house fire. Crews investigated to find a cooking fire on the stove with a smoke condition. Crews removed the hazard and ventilated the structure.

Media Release:

Jonathan Street & Murph Avenue 6/15/2024: On 6/15/24 at about 10:40pm, officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the area of Jonathan Street and Murph Avenue for a report of shots fired. Responding officers discovered that multiple shots had been fired at that location as well as in the area of Jonathan Street and North Avenue. Officers were able to determine that the shots were fired from inside a black sedan. While investigating, the Washington County Emergency Communications Center advised that there was an unoccupied black sedan on fire on Jameson Drive, a short distance from the shooting scenes. The Hagerstown Fire Department responded to the scene of the car fire. Officers were later able to determine that the vehicle had been reported stolen out of Baltimore City and it was the same vehicle involved in the shooting in the Jonathan Street area. The Maryland State Fire Marshal’s Office also responded to the scene to investigate the cause of the fire. Officers recovered multiple shell casings in the Jonathan Street area and also discovered that two parked unoccupied vehicles had been hit by gunfire. There are no reports of gunshot victims. This is an active and ongoing investigation. There is no further information to be released at this time. W. Church Street - 6/16/2024: On 6/16/24 at about 9:50pm Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the area of the 500 block of W. Church Street for a report of shots fired. On arrival, officers located numerous shell casings and discovered that unoccupied vehicles had been struck. There are no reports of victims struck by gunfire.

Arrest Made In 2022 Homicide Case: Murder suspect Taejon Gill was arrested on 6/13/24 in Charlotte, NC on an outstanding warrant in the death Sharron Clark. The homicide occurred on October 18, 2022 on Murph Avenue. HPD would like to thank the following agencies for assistance on this case: Maryland State Apprehension Team, Capital Area Regional Task Force and Carolinas Regional Fugitive Task Force. A special thank you to the HPD detectives that worked on this case. They tirelessly investigated and worked relentlessly to see that Gill was brought to justice. Gill is awaiting extradition back to Maryland. The Department will not be releasing any information regarding the events leading up to his arrest in order to protect certain investigative details.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
