## DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

### **Community Development**

On Wednesday, July 10<sup>th</sup>, staff presented at the Rotary Club to share about the Hagerstown Youth Council’s accomplishments and future opportunities.

### Department Representation at Events

On Tuesday, July 9 team members & elected City officials visited Duvinage, staircase manufacturers, to recognize the 59-year employment anniversary of their team member, Ronnie Hott. Mr. Hott was presented with a Certificate of Appreciation by the Mayor (and Councilmembers Schindler & Perini), and staff were invited by company president, Bob Maruszewski, to tour their production facility at 60 W. Oak Ridge Drive.

### Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

Team members & Mayor Martinez joined Lowe’s for the “board cutting” and grand opening ceremony to celebrate their recent facility expansion from 220,000 to 443,000 square feet at 990 Wesel Boulevard. This capital improvement project launched the transitioning of the site from “Flatbed Distribution Center” to “Flatbed Fulfillment Center,” enabling the warehouse to send supplies not only to stores, but directly to job sites.

## ENGINEERING

1. **Hagerstown Field House** – a “topping-out” ceremony was held at the site on July 12<sup>th</sup>, as the final steel beam for the center building was set. Work will be concentrated on the fit-out of the interior of the building.
2. **Hub City Garage** – construction is nearing completion, with the parking equipment installed and the elevator being tested. Staff anticipates that the facility will be ready for use and occupancy by the end of the month.
3. **Pavement Preservation** – Craig Paving is completing the FY 24 street resurfacing, including work on Memorial Blvd., Brookline Avenue, and other streets.
4. **Dual Highway Traffic Signals** – The new traffic signals at Dual Highway/Lois Harrison Blvd. and Edgewood Drive/Paul Smith Blvd. have been put into full operation.

## Significant Incidents

7/1/24 - *Natural Gas Leak/Fire* - HFD units responded to 1000 Willow Cir for a reported gas leak with fire to the rear of Antietam Cable. Units arrived to find an active gas leak with fire emanating from a trench to the rear of the building. ## Significant Incidents

7/3/24 - *Vehicle Fire* – HFD units responded to the 100 Blk of West Side Ave for a vehicle fire. Crews arrived to find a working vehicle fire and worked to quickly bring the fire under control.

7/4/24 - *Small Fire in House* – HFD units responded for a reported house fire at 346 N Mulberry St. Units arrived to find smoke showing from the rear basement stairway and stretched handlines. A small smoldering fire was found and extinguished in the basement. One occupant was assessed for burns.

7/8/24 - *Working House Fire* – In the early morning hours, HFD was dispatched to 49 Randolph Ave for a reported house fire. Battalion Chief 3 arrived to find a 2.5 story single family residence with heavy smoke showing. The Battalion Aide did a circle check and advised of fire showing from a rear corner window on the first floor. Crews stretched attack lines to contain the fire and performed searches. All occupants made it out safely. No injuries were reported.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
