Staff attended the “Topping-Off” ceremony at the Hagerstown Field House on Friday, July 12. Numerous elected officials and representatives, as well as special guests were on hand to celebrate the raising and placement of the final beam on the building.

1. Dual Highway Safety Project – staff hosted a two-day workshop with representatives from Smart Growth America and the Maryland Department of Transportation to plan for the installation of a demonstration safety project on Dual Highway between Cannon Avenue and Cleveland Avenue.
2. Hub City Garage – final inspections of various systems are being completed, with the goal to receive a temporary Use & Occupancy permit and opening the deck to the public before the end of the month.
3. Pavement Preservation – Craig Paving completed paving on Brookline Avenue and Medway Road, and has finished the FY 24 Pavement Preservation work. The FY 25 program will begin in the spring of 2025.

Significant Incidents

7/10/24 - *Working House Fire* – HFD units responded to 609 George St for a reported house fire. Crews arrived to find light smoke showing from the residence. Upon completion of a circle check, crews found a working fire in the rear of the structure. The fire was quickly knocked down without extension to other floors. There were no injuries reported.

7/10/24 - *Vehicle Accident w/ Entrapment* – HFD units responded to the 1200 block of Potomac Ave for a vehicle accident with rollover. Units arrived to confirm a vehicle on its side, into a pole, with the occupant trapped in the vehicle. Additional HFD units were requested for more staffing and equipment. Crews used extrication tools to cut the vehicle apart and successfully remove the occupant. The occupant was transported to the hospital for treatment.

7/13/24 - *Working House Fire* – HFD units responded to 133 W Bethel St for a reported house fire. Responding crews could see a large column of smoke from blocks away. Battalion Chief 3 arrived to find a 2-story single family dwelling with heavy smoke showing. Crews found heavy fire conditions to the rear of the structure. Multiple hoselines were stretched and crews began knocking down the fire. Additional crews conducted a search of the structure, with no one found inside. Once the fire was extinguished, the scene was turned over to the Fire Marshal's Office to conduct an investigation.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
