On Monday, July 29 staff attended the groundbreaking ceremony for the Horizon Goodwill Industries Horizon Market at 200 N. Prospect St. This venture will offer fresh food and household staples to the downtown neighborhood and will provide access to healthier eating options, as well as providing job training opportunities in grocery retail.

Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

On Thursday, August 1 we celebrate the Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Vital Care of Hagerstown at 1185 Imperial Drive, Suite 101. Vital Care of Hagerstown is a Home Infusion & Specialty Pharmacy, helping improve the quality of life for patients, helping physicians manage complex disease states and facilitating administration of medications that are difficult to store and/or administer.

ENGINEERING

1. **Hub City Garage** – a temporary Use & Occupancy certificate was issued for the facility; parking staff intend to have a soft opening of the garage next week, with a ribbon cutting ceremony scheduled for August 7th.
2. **Summerland Manor Trash Discussion** – staff attended a meeting with the Board of Directors and residents of the development to discuss trash and recycling collection. Summerland has a large percentage of older residents, and it can be difficult for them to maneuver the trash carts to the curb for collection. Staff is working with the Board to develop a solution.
3. **Projects Out to Bid** – staff was busy preparing contract documents for several projects: Wheaton Park Play Equipment, City Hall First Floor Renovations, and traffic signal replacements at two different intersections. We currently have six (6) projects out for bids; some bids will be opened in mid-August, and others will be opened in early September.

Media Release: On 8/1/24 at about 11:00pm, HPD responded to the 300 block of N Jonathan St for a shooting incident. The male victim, later identified as Tyrone Earl Nelson (age 45 of Waynesboro PA), was transported to Meritus Medical Center where he was pronounced deceased. The shooting occurred after there was a dispute between the victim and the suspect who were known to one another. Detectives and the Western Maryland Regional Crime Lab responded to the scene.

The suspect was identified as Brian Anthony Nelson, age 24 of Hagerstown. Nelson was arrested at approximately 2:00am when he turned himself in at the Washington County Sheriff's Office. He is charged with the following: 1st & 2nd Degree Murder; 1st & 2nd Degree Assault; Reckless Endangerment; Various Handgun Violations. He is currently detained at the Washington County Detention Center.

Welcome Back: Officer James Robison has completed training and was certified this week for solo patrol as a Part Time Police Officer. Officer Robison retired in 2018 as a Lieutenant at HPD after serving more than twenty years.

CHART NO. 2 – A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY





CHART NO. 3 – UD PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
