ENGINEERING

1. Dual Highway Safety Project – work crews from the State Highway Administration and our Department of Public Works began installation of flexible delineator posts, pavement markings, and other features on Dual Highway between Cannon Avenue and Cleveland Avenue. This work is part of a temporary demonstration project to improve vehicular and pedestrian safety; these features will remain in place until November.
2. Hagerstown Field House – work continues to close-in the building so that the contractor can begin installation of the sports flooring and equipment. The roof over the central building has been completed, so the building is now dry inside.
3. Safe Streets for All Action Plan – staff, working with the Hagerstown-Eastern Panhandle Metropolitan Planning Organization, are preparing to launch an online public survey to allow residents to identify safety concerns and issues on the City’s street network. This survey will be used to inform the recommendations in the final Action Plan report, and will allow the City to apply for grants to actually implement safety improvement projects in the future.

Officer of the Month: Officers Jon Molineaux and Jacob Mull have been selected as the July Officers of the Month for their actions on July 31, 2024. Officer Mull was en route to a search warrant brief when assistance was requested by the US Marshals for an unrelated car involving a person wanted for an attempted murder shooting. Officer Mull planned to meet USMS at a location off of the Dual Highway. While en route to that location, Officer Mull observed the suspect vehicle in the southeast part of city limits. Officer Mull followed the vehicle and coordinated the apprehension of the suspect with USMS and Warrant Squad. The suspect was taken into custody safely and had two small children in the vehicle. The investigation was turned over to a neighboring jurisdiction following the apprehension. Officer Mull and Officer Molineaux coordinated as a team to observe, track and take into custody a person considered armed and dangerous. Congratulations to both officers on their excellent work.

Media Releases:

Friday, 08/23/2024: On Friday 08/23/2024, Ashley Franklin (age 37) was arrested by South Fulton Police Department in South Fulton, Georgia. Franklin was wanted for failing to appear in court in March of 2024. Franklin was originally charged in October of 2021 for causing the death of her 10 month old daughter. Her charges include: Child Abuse-1st Degree under the age of 13; Child Abuse 1st Degree - Severe Physical Injury Involuntary Manslaughter; Neglect of a Minor. She is currently awaiting extradition back to Maryland. HPD would like to thank South Fulton PD, Capital Area Regional Fugitive Task Force (US Marshals), and the Maryland State Apprehension Team (MSAT) for their assistance in the apprehension.

Thursday, 08/28/2024: On 8/28/24 at about 3:35 pm Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the 100 block of E. Washington Street for a shooting. Officers apprehended the suspect in the 300 block of Liberty Street within minutes of the shooting following a foot pursuit. The victim, later identified as Deangelo Rouzer, age 41 of Hagerstown, was transported to Meritus Medical Center with numerous gunshots. Rouzer is expected to survive. Through the course of the investigation, it was learned that the victim and suspect are known to each other and the shooting was targeted. The suspect is identified as 17-year-old Micha Ricks of Hagerstown. Ricks has been charged as an adult with the following: Attempted 1st & 2nd Degree Murder; 1st & 2nd Degree Assault; Reckless Endangerment; Numerous Firearms related charges. Ricks is currently being held at the Washington County Detention Center. This investigation was supported in part by the Maryland Criminal Intelligence Network (MCIN). The Governor's Office of Crime Prevention and Policy (GOCPP) supplies grant funding and strategic assistance to MCIN member sites. These resources enable the identification, disruption, and dismantling of criminal organizations through enhanced inter-agency collaboration and data sharing, contributing to a safer Maryland for all.

Recruiting Reminder: The next comprehensive testing date will be Saturday, August 31st at Hagerstown Community College. Applicants will take the written exam, physical test and complete a panel interview. Applicants passing all three areas will be given a conditional offer of employment pending a successful background investigation. Starting salary is \$53,248-\$87,651 depending on experience. New officer candidates will be hired at the end of the process while they await the January 2025 academy. The City of Hagerstown is offering a \$20,000 sign-on bonus for lateral transfers and a \$10,000 bonus for comparative compliance candidates. 
HUB CITY GARAGE

Data for the newly opened Hub City Garage is finally available. Staff continues to learn the new management software called Janus Management System. The A&E Parking Deck and UD Parking Deck are still using a software called DataPark. Eventually, all three parking structures will use the Janus operating system. There are still bugs to work out and access to the software by staff is still limited.


The official opening of Hub City Garage was Wednesday, August 7th and on August 24th the facility met capacity at 398 cars. Those parking were mostly there to attend a ball game at Meritus Park. The weekend attendance proved the value of the parking garage for the downtown. Some parking passes have already been sold to the Hub City Garage with more expected to come online in the near future.

A review of the charts showing occupancy shows just how different the three parking garages are utilized. The charts can be a bit deceiving. The A&E Parking Deck, being the smallest of the garages at 185 parking spaces, is showing its occupancy in 20 space units of occupancy. The UD Parking Deck (440 spaces) and the Hub City Garage (398 spaces) is showing its occupancy in increments of 50 along its X axis. However, it still shows the consistent use of the A&E Parking Deck throughout the week and weekends. The UD Parking Deck is mostly pass holders throughout the week. Finally, Hub City Garage is still finding its footing during the week.


A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
